The Weather

The high yesterday 75° The low this morning 48°

Lampasas County is under a wind advisory until noon.

Lampasas received a total of 1.04 inches
of rain yesterday.

Today: Look for sunny skies and a high temperature near 73°. The wind will be W-NW near 10-20 mph gusting as high as 30 mph.

Tonight: Look for clear skies and a low that will be around 46°. The wind will become calm.

Wednesday: Sunny with a high temperature near 78°. Winds will become SE near 5-10 mph.

Wednesday Night: Clear skies with a low near 49°. Wind will be SE near 5 mph.

Thursday: Sunny with a high temperature near 79°. Winds will be S near 5-15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Thursday Night: A low near 53° with mostly cloudy skies. There is a 60% chance of showers and storms overnight. The wind will be S-SE near 10 mph becoming W-SW overnight gusting to 20 mph.

Storm Causes

Power Outages

Lampasas Radio reached out to the City of Lampasas Public Works Dept. and spoke with Ryan.

The Naruna Feeder Line is the line that was compromised during last night's storm. This is an LCRA line. Branches/limbs and debris hit the line, causing it to break. The City of Lampasas and LCRA were involved in the repairs.

While the City did not know the number of homes or businesses affected, Ryan said the outage was basically south of Sulphur Creek, southwest to the high school, east to the Wal Mart area including the Sue Ann addition and the Santa Fe shopping center, and out 183 south.

Due to the hard work of our city staff, everyone was back online in a few hours.

The City of Lampasas has opened up the citizen collection center today so city residents (you have to be a city resident to use the collection center) can drop off storm debris. This service will be free through the end of November.

The Blotter



The Lampasas Police Dept. Blotter for Monday shows an early morning report of a suspicious vehicle in the 2300 block of 580W at 12:02am. There was a reported fraud in the 600 block of N. Key Ave. at 8:35am. At 9:36am Jharmesha DarLynn White, 39, of Killeen was arrested in the 600 block of N. Walnut St. for fraud with intent to obtain a controlled substance at 9:36am. There was a harassment reported in the 700 block of Old Georgetown Rd. at 10:25am. The afternoon shows a minor accident in the 600 block of E. 3rd St. at 12:18pm, a criminal trespass was reported in the 500 block of N. Broad St. at 1:07pm and a disturbance was reported in the 200 block of W. 3rd St. at 6:35pm. There was a noise complaint in the 1400 block of S. Chestnut St. at 7:30pm, a suspicious vehicle was reported in the 300 block of N. Key Ave. at 7:41pm and a DWI was reported in the 800 block of N. Key Ave. at 7:45pm. At 8:01pm, William Thies Jr., 55, of Kempner was arrested for DWI w/ blood alcohol content greater than .15 in the 800 block of N. Key Ave. A suspicious vehicle was reported in the 100 block of Riverview Dr. at 8:50pm.

The Lampasas Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Monday shows Lometa with a civil matter. Kempner shows a mental health call and a reported trespassing. Out in the county there were medical calls, civil matters, accidents, a fish & game call, and a request for extra patrol.

The Jail Log shows Caleb Loya, 24 and Cristjyn Tuma, 26 of Copperas Cove booked in on commitment charges.

(cont'd from front) Adam Trejo failed to appear on the charge of failing to register as a sex offender.

There were 5 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 2 cases for less than a gram, 2 cases for 1-4 grams and 1 case for possession of 4-200 grams. There was 1 DWI case.

There was one case of the following: prohibited substance in a correctional facility, evading arrest, criminal mischief \$2500-\$30,000, taking wildlife resources without consent, forgery, burglary, tampering with evidence and theft of property.

In crimes involving personal harm, there was 1 case each for intoxication manslaughter, intoxication assault, injury to a child/elderly/disabled person, failure to comply as a sex offender, interference with child custody, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, accident involving injury, arson and abandoning/jeopardizing a child.

Of the 23 cases 4 were resolved with Seth Fleming of Copperas Cove pleading guilty to a class A misdemeanor or taking certain wildlife resources without consent. Mr. Fleming received 2 years probation plus court costs of \$370 and a \$1700 fine. Frederick Delacruz Jr. of Lampasas was found guilty of intoxication assault and sentenced to 10 years probation, 60 days in county jail, a \$4000 fine and court costs of \$325. Billy Joe Fralin pled guilty to DWI w/a child under 15 in the vehicle and was sentenced to 18 months in State Jail with no court costs and credit for days served. On the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1, 1-4 grams, Mr. Fralin was found guilty and was sentenced to 3 years TDCJ.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

Burn Ban in Effect

County Judge Randy Hoyer has established a county-wide burn ban until January 21, 2023. There are a few exceptions. You can have campfires, BBQ's, and burn household trash that is in an area free of debris with a mesh covering with holes no bigger than 1/4 inch. Also allowed are controlled burns, those prescribed by TCEQ, fireworks shows with licensed pyrotechnic operators, and air curtain incinerators.

Early Voting Numbers

In Lampasas County yesterday, 608 residents went to the polls. There were also 218 mail in ballots for a total of 826 early votes.

In Lampasas, early voting is from 8am-5pm Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. On Tuesday October 25th and Tuesday November 1, early voting will be available from 7am to 7pm. All other days are 8am-5pm. The elections office is located at 407 S. Pecan St. #102 for those who want to vote early.
