Meeting Minutes

The Weather

The High yesterday 64° @ 3am
The Low this morning 35° (the wind chill is 27°)
There was no measurable rain at the airport.

The low clouds/fog/drizzle is expected to last into tomorrow. Some areas will see the temperatures warming after midnight. Showers with a few embedded storms will continue into Wednesday, and most areas are expected to see measurable rainfall, with 80%-100% probabilities. The clouds and rain will hold our temperatures in the 40's and low 50's. The forecasters say the system will move out on Wednesday evening. Dry and cool weather is expected Friday through the weekend

Today: Drizzle and light rain with cloudy skies all day with a high near 43°. Winds will be from the N at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Cloudy skies with a 90% chance of precipitation through the night. The low will be near 43° and winds continue from the N at 10-15 mph with gusts of 20 mph.

Wednesday: Cloudy skies in the morning with a 60% chance of showers and storms. Skies will then become mostly sunny with a high near 55°. Winds will be NW at 15 mph gusting to 25 mph. **Wednesday Night**: Mostly clear skies with a low near 42°. Winds will be from the W-NW at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph. **Thursday**: Sunny with a high near 60°, and gusty NW winds at 15-2 mph. Winds gusts of 30 mph are possible.

Thursday Night: Mostly clear with a low near 40°. Winds will be brisk from the N-NW at 10-15 mph, gusting to 25 mph.

Early Voting

This will be the last week for early voting for the General Election on November 3rd. The Lampasas County Elections office is open until 7pm tonight, and 8am-5pm the rest of the week. `According to the Texas Secretary of State, as of October 25th, 7.4 million voters had cast ballots. It is estimated that Texas could see 10-12 million voters at the polls, which would be record breaking.

Locally, 349 residents voted yesterday for a total of 5,997 in-person votes. 883 mail-in ballots were received for a total of 6,880 votes cast in Lampasas County.



City Council

The Lampasas City Council met yesterday evening for a regularly scheduled workshop session and meeting.

The monthly investment report for September 2020 was approved. The ordinance restricting pedestrian crossing on 281S between 10th St. and the county line was approved, as well as vacating the alleyway/right of way between E. 9th St. and Spring Ho Ave with conditions.

There were no departmental reports, however Finley de Graffenreid gave the City Manager's operational report in which he spoke of W. 3rd St. being closed due to old culverts eroding away causing roadway and drainage problems. Asst. City Manager Rickie Roy is obtaining input from engineers as how to best address this problem. The City Manager also addressed Council about an ongoing issue of mail being mis-delivered in Lampasas, or not delivered at all. This creates problems for people who rely on mail for medications and important information. The postmaster has been invited to the City Council's next workshop session. Hopefully he will attend to discuss this problem.



According to KXXV, Copperas Cove High School is temporarily transitioning to At Home Learning after an increase in COVID-19 cases at the school.

Copperas Cove High School students will transition to At Home Learning from October

28, 2020 through at least November 5, 2020.

"As you know, CCISD has been delivering face-to-face and virtual instruction to CCHS students since August 18, 2020. During this time, the staff and students who attend classes on campus have been wearing facial coverings, sanitizing and washing their hands frequently and maintaining appropriate social distancing during the school day," said Copperas Cove ISD Superintendent of Schools Dr. Joe Burns in a letter to parents.

"With these safety protocols in place, we have had a minimal number of positive COVID-19 cases and exposures. However, in the last few days, we seen an increase in the number of staff and students testing positive for COVID-19 and another small group of individuals exposed to those who have tested positive."

All of CCISD's other schools and facilities will continue operations on-site and on their normal schedules.

Athletic and band practices will continue as scheduled with the requirements of the wearing of facial coverings, hand sanitizing and washing, and social distancing still required, according to Dr. Burns..

No doubt, at some point they would have asked for banking information, you would most certainly have banking errors after sharing your personal information and banking information with the caller.

Scammers also send messages and emails saying that they are from the Federal Reserve and they are holding money owed to you. Do not click links contained in text messages or emails and delete them immediately
