The Weather



The high yesterday 37° This morning's low 35°

Today: Light rain this morning, otherwise cloudy and cool with a high near 54° this afternoon. The W-NW wind could come in at 15-20 mph and possibly gusting to 30, however that didn't seem to be a factor as of 10am this morning. Rainfall shouldn't amount to more than 1/10 of an inch.

Tonight: Mostly clear with a low around 41° with W-NW wind 10-15 mph and gustin to 25.

Thursday: Mostly sunny and up to 55° in the afternoon. The W-NW wind will be a big factor, 20 mph typical and gusting to 35 mph.

The evening will see a steep drop in temperatures as the front comes through, dropping the temperature down to 39° as the 15-20 mph wind shifts around to northerly and gusts to 25.

The Rest of the Week: Friday brings sunshine and a warm-up to about 65° for the afternoon, then drops down to about 40° overnight. The wind will shift back to easterly and calm.

Going into the weekend we see a nice warm-up in the picture for Saturday, getting up to 71°. Sunday and Monday will see upper 60s highs.

Early Voting Continues

Just 3 more days to Early Vote!

Friday will be the last day for in person early voting. According to the Lampasas Elections Office 505 people cast their votes on Tuesday. The total number since early voting began is 7,384 including about 900 mail in ballots. That is 47.8% of the total registered voters in the county. That follows pretty close to what's going on in the state as a whole.

You will be able to cast your early vote through Friday, October 30th at the Lampasas County Conference Room at 409 S. Pecan St.

After Early Voting ends on Oct. 30th, you can vote on Tuesday, Nov. 3rd, Election Day, at your favorite polling place. That can be any one of the five spots in the County.

The County, and the Country, needs your vote.

There will be two performances on Sunday, doors opening at 1:30 pm, and the second beginning at 5:00pm. \$5 admission.

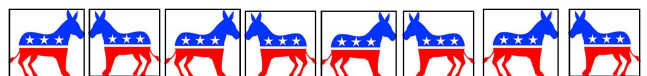

The Amazing Badgers

Not since the days of Badger Coach Jet Wilson have fans had so much fun at Friday night football games. Yeah, some of us remember the white shoes and Circus Offense with 360 possible sets. It was crazy.

These days the team doesn't use a lot of razzle-dazzle, they just have the most amazing group of kids and coaching staff that puts it all together. We were looking at some stats...like the 48.8 points per game average that the Badgers put on the scoreboards. Lessee, #22 Jack Jerome averages 121 yards per game rushing. QB Ace Whitehead averages 280 yards per game if you add up his personal rushing and passing yards. He is the district's best passer with roughly a 63% completion rate and if he tucks and runs he's probably better than most of the district's running backs.

Total yards per game for the Badgers? When we looked at recent records it was an average of 483-plus yards per game.

It's pretty amazing too, the way the Badger line manages to protect a QB that the other team knows is going to pass over and over again...to several good receivers. Michael Murray, jr is the most noticeable because he's the district-leading long ball guy with a 60-something yards per catch average. There's Lane Haviland though, whose stats are just a tiny bit behind Murray's. And there are the sophomores Ethan Moreno and Carter Johnson and senior Cade White, and running back Jack Jerome. All these guys are very capable receivers for QB Ace Whitehead to throw his league leading passes.

On defense, Case Brister leads the team in tackles, with Keagan Richardson and Daxton Brookerson also in the top ten. Josh Carter and Owen Seaver lead the district in sacks. When the Badgers need to hold their opponents back at critical time, their defense has stepped up.

So, while we know that somewhere along the line, every team meets its match...so far this Badger team hasn't. This week the Canyon Lake Hawks are hosting the amazing Badgers, and hoping for an upset.
