Monday: Sunny, with a high near 66. A North wind will be blowing around 5 mph, and you can expect a southeast in the afternoon.


Monday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 40. An East southeast wind will be blowing in at around 5 mph becoming southwest after midnight.




Sports

Coach Troy Rogers' unbeaten Badgers cinch District Championship in game number

The Badgers 40-34 win on the scoreboard last night saw them with 502 yards total offense against Canyon Lakes' 492. Much like the score, it was close.

The Badgers passing yards were 356, the Hawks 153. The Badgers rushing yards were 146, the Hawks 339.

Badger passing by Ace Whitehead was 11 of 17 for 5 TDs but with 1 reception. On the receiving end of the passes was Michael Murray 6 catches for 219 yards and 2 TDs. Lane Haviland caught 3 for 110 yards and 2 TDs, and Cade White got 1 for 19 yards and a TD. Ethan





Moreno caught 1 for 8 yards.

Rushing yards came from Jack Jerome with 16 carries for 102 yards and a TD. Ace Whitehead carried 11 times for 42 yards and Ethan Moreno

ran once for 2 yards.

Next Friday the Badgers will meet Fredericksburg in the last regular season district game. Fredericksburg was thought to be near the top of the heap before the season began, and they looked good in pre-district games, but since then it has been a rough go for the Billies as they are 1-3 in district, in the lower half of the pack standings. That said, they slayed Taylor last night and they have QB Cole Immel that, last time we looked, had thrown for more yards than anyone else in the district. He is also a leading rusher on the team.

Taylor lost again, making them 0-8 overall and 0-3 in district after losing to Fredericksburg last night.

LBJ Austin is 4-2 overall, 3-1 in district, after their win over Burnet 18-10 last night.

The Lometa Hornets met the better team last night as the Jonesboro boys came up with the district championship win over the Hornets in a 56-12 rout last night in Lometa. The Hornets finish the district's regular season with a 7-2 overall record and runner-up in district.

San Saba's Armadillos are 4-0 in district after beating

Coleman 43-10 last night. It looked close at 7-3 at the end of the 1st quarter, then San Saba began to move. Early in the 2nd it was 14 -3 and at half-time the dillos were ahead 17-3. They kept up the pressure until the end and final 43-10 finish.

That leaves San Saba and Cisco tied at 4-0 and headed for the final district championship showdown game next Friday in San Saba.
