# Lampasas ISD School Board

The School Board approved the following on November 1, 2021: Minutes of School Board Meeting on October 4, 2021, Budget Amendment, Quarterly Investment Report, Annual Investment Report, Notice of Resignation of Professional Personnel, Public Notice that Lampasas ISD Uses Internet Filtering, Change of January Board Meeting Date to January 10,2022, and Request for Maximum Class Size Exception Waiver.

School attendance numbers have improved since the beginning of the school year. The option of an off-campus lunch once a semester will be available to students in good academic standing.

At the Lampasas High School, an Intervention program has been implemented to help with Closing the Gap. The program will be more structured this year and students who fail the STAAR test will be required to complete 30 hours of acceleration work per class. Summer School will be lengthened and formatted differently this year. There has been a new attendance plan implemented for Truancy and Clock Hours as well as a Saturday School. The High School has established a Campus Wide Writing Initiative which requires students to spend a specified time per week practicing writing in different genres to improve upon their writing and focuses on properly structuring sentences. And Early College Prep Math and English Program for CCMR Certification has also been implemented. .

OnRamps courses are dual enrollment with the Lampasas High School and University of Texas which offers students the ability to earn college credits while still in High School. Onramps Courses now include OnRamps Stats, OnRamps Biology, OnRamps Chemistry, and OnRamps U.S. History.

Character Wednesdays are held every other Wednesday and allow for figures in the community to discuss issues and leadership with the student population. Lampasas High School would have scored and 88, or B+ ranking, had the Accountability Rating taken place.

# **District Court Notes**

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Docket Call on October 29th. Presiding over the Court was 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 19 cases were brought to the court with 17 cases involving men, and 2 cases involving women. The following defendants failed to appear: Dakota Price of Lampasas on the charge of abandon/endanger a child/criminal negligence, Jeffrey Fielding of Gatesville on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1/less than a gram, and Shannon Crumbley of San Lorenzo, New Mexico on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1/4-200 grams.

There were 6 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/ PG1. There were 3 cases for less than a gram, 2 cases for 1-4 grams, and 1 case for 4-200 grams. There was also 1 case for possession of a controlled substance/PG2 less than a gram, and one case for possession of a controlled substance PG1-1B (Fentanyl) 1-4 grams.

There were 4 burglary cases, two cases for theft \$2500-\$30,000, and one case each for evading w/ a vehicle/watercraft, tampering with evidence and robbery.

There was one case for aggravated sexual assault of a child, and one case for abandoning/endangering a child.

Of the 19 cases, 5 were settled with Joe Garza of Lampasas pleading guilty to tampering w/evidence and was sentenced to 8 years probation w/ SAFPF as a condition, and his other charge, possession of a controlled substance PG1/1-4 grams was barred. Kurt Avila of Kempner, on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1/less than a gram was sentenced to 90 days county jail with credit for days served. Christopher Macgeorge of Leander plead guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1/1-4 grams and received 3 years in TDCJ with credit for days served. Kimberly Garrett of Bryan saw her probation extended by 1 year for possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. The rest of the cases were reset or had dates set for jury trials.

# **Coronavirus Update**

Statewide, according to the DSHS, there were 922 new and 404 probable new cases on November 1st, along with 19 deaths. There were also 3,380 Texans in the hospital with Covid-19. Locally, the DSHS dashboard for cases shows 2new confirmed cases in Lampasas County on November 1st, and 30 confirmed cases in the last 14 days. The state estimates Lampasas County to have 47 active cases at this time.
