Area Election Results:

Lampasas County had a total of 10,405 ballots cast in the General Election yesterday. 7,687 in early voting and 1,743 on election day. For federal races, Incumbent President Donald Trump carried Texas, Senator John Cornyn soundly defeated MJ Hegar, Roger Williams defeated Julie



Oliver. Closer to home, State Senator Dawn Buckingham kept her office, as well as Brad Buckley.

There were several uncontested races in Lampasas, including Sheriff Jess Ramos, County Attorney, 27th District Judge, and County Tax Assessor.

The 3 places up for the City Council, places 3, 4, and 5. In the race for place 3, Gordon Nelson (1,527 votes) defeated Chuck Williamson (966 votes). Place 4 was uncontested and went to Cathy Kuehne, and in the contested place 5 election, Bob Goodart (1,306 votes) beat out Zach Taylor (1,154 votes).



The city of Lometa had a new mayor elected yesterday, Stephen Brister Hicks (90 votes) defeated Carlos Garcia (36 votes) and Sarah Salinas (62 votes).



District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on October 30th.

Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 23 cases were brought to the court, 17 of them involved men and 6 involved women

There were 6 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1; 2 for under 1 gram, one for less than a gram in a drug free zone, one for 1-4 grams, and 2 for 4-200 grams. There was also one case for DWI 3rd or more. There was one case for theft, \$2500-\$30000. There were 2 cases for engaging in organized criminal activity. There were 3 cases of debit/credit card abuse with one with an elderly victim. There was one case for evading w/a vehicle and 2 cases for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. Crimes causing personal harm included one case each for abandoning/endangering a child/criminal negligence, accident involving injury, one for aggravated assault causing serious bodily injury. One for deadly conduct/discharge a firearm, and 2 murder cases. There was one case of indecency with a child/sexual contact

Of the 23 cases presented to the court, one case was settled with Keshawn Ratliff found guilty of murder and was sentenced to 8 years in TDCJ w/ credit for time served.

The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date.

The State of Texas had 7,215 new cases reported yesterday, and 5,936 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19. Lampasas County has 21 active cases with 432 total cases.

New Traffic Lights at FM 2808 & Hwy 190

From TxDOT: Beginning the week of November 9 the Texas Department of Transportation's (TxDOT) Brownwood District will install a new traffic signal at the intersection of US 190 and FM 2808 near Kempner. In addition to the new signals, TxDOT's contractor Texas Materials Group, Inc. of Cedar Park, will also construct an acceleration lane on the east end of the intersection and a deceleration lane on the west end of the intersection. The signal is being placed due to an increased amount of traffic entering US 190 from FM 2808. The presence of the new signals will provide motorists additional safety turning from or onto FM 2808. The acceleration/deceleration lanes will also allow for a safer transition when entering or exiting US 190.
