Falling Back

One week after Halloween, expect the annual trick (early sunsets) and treat (sleeping in) -- daylight saving time is coming to an end.

Daylight saving time: Fact and fiction

It's daylight saving time, not daylight "savings" time. You are saving daylight, not savings daylight.

Contrary to popular belief, daylight saving time was not invented for the benefit of farmers. Credit for Daylight Saving Time belongs to Benjamin Franklin, who first suggested the idea in 1784.

The Germans were the first to officially adopt the light-extending system in 1915 as a fuel-saving measure during World War I..

Many experts have pointed to the time change's adverse health effects, and studies show 7 in 10 Americans preferred not to switch back and forth.

Circadian biologists believe ill health effects from daylight saving time result from a mismatch among the sun "clock." This impacts our social clock -- like work and school schedules -- and the body's internal 24-hour body clock.

Ticking away at the molecular level, the biological clock is entrained -- or set -- by exposure to sunlight and darkness. It regulates bodily functions such as metabolism, blood pressure and hormones that promote sleep and alertness.

Time changes mess with sleep schedules, a potential problem when so many people are already sleep-deprived, says Dr. Phyllis Zee, a sleep researcher at Northwestern Medicine in Chicago.

The U.S. Department of Transportation, which oversees daylight saving time, says the additional sunlight later in the day saves energy, results in fewer traffic and pedestrian fatalities, and reduces lawlessness, since "more people are out conducting their affairs during the daylight rather than at night, when more crime occurs."

Monday Meetings

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court will meet Monday at 9am in the Commissioners Courtroom at the Lampasas County Courthouse.

The agenda includes the consent agenda, a discussion of Lampasas County redistricting, remodel work in the JP precinct 1 office, the district clerk's office and the treasurer's office. Also CTCOG has determined a public safety need for 911 physical addressing for residential structures on E. US Hwy 190, the recommended name is Private Road 3065. There is also a resolution for voting on Lampasas Central Appraisal District Board of Directors.

The Lampasas City Council will meet Monday at 5:30am for regularly scheduled meetings. On the agenda is the consent agenda, the City Manager's operational report including park projects and an update on a sub station and the 580 sports complex. There will be discussion and possible action concerning the approval of a bid from Hoffpauir Ford for \$49,459 for a 2022 F350 4x4 for the D&C superintendent, adding fees related to WI-FI "hot spot" device lending, regarding a 2005 JD lightweight Fairway Mower to deem as surplus and allow staff to dispose of as state allows, cancelling the December 27th City Council meeting, and Council will go into executive session regarding "relating to the authority of public power utility governing bodies to deliberate regarding competitive matters". Council will then go back into regular session for action on the items in executive session.

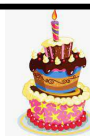

Coronavirus Update

Statewide, on November 5th, there were 2,593 new and 783 probable cases, along with 3,018 in the hospital. There were 141 deaths from Covid reported as well. Locally, in the last 14 days, Lampasas has seen 26 confirmed cases according to the DSHS website, with 0 being confirmed yesterday. The state estimate is 39 active cases in Lampasas County.
