The Weather

Today: Skies will be mostly cloudy with a high temperature near 74°, and an S wind near 5-10 mph shifting S-SW in the afternoon with 20 mph gusts possible.

Lampasas City Council

The Lampasas City Council held their regularly scheduled meetings yesterday, during the workshop session it was brought up that the COVID-19 cases have been decreasing. There are currently 114,488 active cases in Texas with 67 of those cases being in Lampasas County. In Lampasas County, 9,872 people have received at least one shot of the vaccination with 8,577 people fully vaccinated.

Short-term goals of the Comprehensive Plan Implementation include establishing a new truck route which will divert traffic away from Main Street, connecting walking paths throughout the city's greenbelt, updating Lampasas Parks, Recreation and Open Space Master Plan, supporting and expanding the mission of Lampasas County Higher Education Center, supporting the Fire Department's efforts to increase the amount of training for personnel and supporting the department's advancement in

technology and communication system, and evaluating the needs of EMS response.

There are no requests or recommendations for changes to the Interlocal Agreement between the City of Lampasas and Lampasas County regarding the Airport Property and Operations of Airport Facility which was established in 2011. Further studies were requested regarding Street Repair Costs and Service Tap installation. Repairs to the irrigation system at the 580 Sports Complex have been postponed for two weeks. The Lampasas County Friends of the Night Sky are working to build awareness of how to limit light pollution and the City Electric crews have been upgrading fixture to provide efficient lighting.

A bid from Hoffpauir Ford for a 2022 Ford F350 Super Duty 4x4 to replace the 1999 Ford pickup for the D&C Superintendent was approved. Votes for the Lampasas County Appraisal District Board of Directors will be split evenly as there are no contested positions. A \$10 fee will now be charged upon return of a damaged or incomplete Hot Spot device to the Lampasas Library. Kathryn Hail will be reappointed to Library Advisory board through December 31, 2021. The winner of the website photo contest for October is "Christmas in Lampasas" submitted by Scott Sterba Sr. The City Council Meeting for December 27, 2021 had been cancelled.

Commissioners Court

Commissioners Court was held on November 8, 2021. Items from the Consent Agenda including the treasurer's quarterly report and monthly reports from Auditor, Treasurer, Tax Assessor/Collector, Justices of the Peach, Collections, Sheriff's Report, and Cash and Investments Report were approved. Accounts Payable and Payroll were also approved. Remodel work has been approved for JP#1, Treasurer, and District Clerk Offices. A new 9-1-1 address has been approved for residential structures off E US Highway 190. Voting on the Lampasas Central Appraisal District Board of Directors will be distributed as evenly as possible.

Legally, the county has not deviated greatly enough to be obligated to redistrict. However, redistricting would allow districts to receive services that they need but currently are not obtaining. If considered, the lines must be redone by November 13 and new voter registration cards would need to be sent out for the upcoming elections. This matter will be discussed later, and no action is being taken at this time.

There will be a called meeting on November 11th even though it is a holiday. The meeting will cover redistricting and will be at the County Annex building 1st floor conference room at 12:30pm.

Statewide, according to the DSHS, there were 1,268 new and 283 probable new cases on November 8th, along with 8 deaths. There were also 2,801 Texans in the hospital with Covid-19. Locally, the DSHS dashboard for cases shows 3 new confirmed cases in Lampasas County on November 8th, and 24 confirmed cases in the last 14 days. The state estimates Lampasas County to have 38 active cases at this time.

Texas Poll on the Economy

According to a poll by the University of Texas and the Texas Tribune, Texas voters are feeling down about the state and national economies and pessimistic about the country's general direction, according to the latest University of Texas/Texas Tribune poll.

Fifty-five percent of respondents said the national economy is worse than it was a year ago. That figure includes 25% of Democrats, 51% of independents and 80% of Republicans. When evaluating Texas, 38% of respondents — the plurality — said the state economy is doing worse than it was a year ago. Both Republicans and Democrats shared that sentiment. Twenty-one percent of respondents said the state economy is doing better than a year ago, and 34% said it is about the same.

The data indicates that Texans are still reeling from the economic fallout of the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, according to Joshua Blank, research director for the Texas Politics Project at the University of Texas at Austin.

"When it comes to evaluations of the state economy, Democrats and Republicans view it equally negatively relative to a year ago," Blank said. "It just reflects the reality on the ground here, that no political posturing can paper over, which is the fact that we're still recovering from the economic consequences of the pandemic. And that has hit everybody regardless of your partisan affiliation."

About one in three Texas voters said their personal economic situation is worse now than it was a year ago. Just 20% indicated being better off, and 43% said they were doing "about the same.

More Texas voters than not said they think the state is headed in the wrong direction. Forty percent of Texans said the state is headed in the right direction, while 48% said the state is on the wrong track.
