The Weather

The high yesterday 78° This morning's low 64°



Today: Mostly sunny skies with a high temperature near 80° and S-SW wind at 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Tonight: Look for mostly cloudy skies with a 20% chance of showers and storms overnight. The low will get down to about 55° overnight. Wind will become light and variable.

Veterans Day: Cloudy with showers and possibly a storm and the temperature will fall to near 45° by 5pm. Wind will be from the N at 15-20 mph with possible gusts of 25 mph. There is a 70% chance of precipitation.

Friday Night: Partly cloudy with a low of 36°. Wind will be from the N at 10-15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Saturday: Sunny with the high temperature near 56°. Wind will be N near 10-15 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Saturday Night: Mostly clear skies and a low near 34°. Wind will be NE near 5-10 mph becoming light.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on November 4th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 45 cases were brought to the court with 32 cases involving men, and 13 cases involving women. Bobbie Lee Sparks of Shreveport, Louisiana failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. Michael Orr of State College Georgia failed to appear on the charge of burglary of a habitation/intended other felony.

There were 18 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 10 cases for less than a gram, 6 cases for 1-4 grams and 1 case for possession of 4-200 grams. There was also one case for manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams. There was one case of possession of a controlled substance PG2 1-4 grams. There was 1 DWI case.

There were 4 burglary cases, two for evading arrest and one each for prohibited substance in a correctional facility, engaging in organized criminal activity, theft of a firearm, tampering with evidence, interference with child custody.

In crimes involving personal harm, there were 2 cases each of assault on a family/household member and solicitation/prostitution/person under 18 years of age. There was one case each for aggravated assault on a date/family member w/weapon, abandoning/jeopardizing a child, injury to child/disabled/elderly, intoxication manslaughter, indecency with a child/sexual contact, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, accident involving injury, arson, deadly conduct/discharging a firearm, and harassment of a public servant.

Of the 45 cases 6 were resolved with Angelica Vance-Thrasher pleading guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG 1 less than a gram and was sentenced to 2 years TDCJ/State Jail with court costs running concurrent and credit for days served. Fre Queisha Phillips of Everman, Texas pled guilty to engaging in organized criminal activity and was sentenced to 16 months State Jail with court costs running concurrent and credit for days served. Jon Collins of Lampasas was found guilty of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram and was sentenced to 10 months State Jail with credit for days served and court costs running concurrent. Kimberly Pierce of Copperas Cove on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 4-200 grams, was sentenced to 10 years TDCJ with all 10 years probated plus court costs and a fine. Lonnie Johnson of Copperas Cove on the charge of deadly conduct/discharge firearm was sentenced to 5 years probation plus court costs; on the charge of DWI 3rd or more, Mr. Johnson saw the motion to adjudicate pulled back.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

Sales Tax Rebates

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced last week he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts 1.1 Billion dollars in local sales tax allocations for November. That is up 7% from last year. These allocations are based on sales made in September by businesses.

In our area, Evant in Hamilton County saw their rebate decrease 0.90% over the same period last year, with a \$5771.16 rebate. The City of Hamilton saw a 12.12% increase over the same period last year in their rebate check of \$88,229.55.

In Lampasas County, Lampasas shows their rebate is up 3.44% in their check of \$251,279.95. Lometa shows an increase of 16.27% over last year with a rebate check for \$9,675.22 and Kempner received a rebate for \$14,113.19, a 3.65% increase from last year.

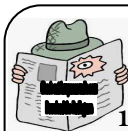

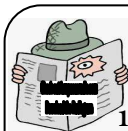
