The Weather

The high yesterday 76° This morning's low 43°

A pretty day, with the overnight lows a bit warmer tonight due to cloud cover expected west of I35. Keeping the temperatures steady. The forecasters say that these conditions will prevail through Saturday night. However, a strong cold front is expected on Sunday that should make its way through our area early in the morning. Temperatures are forecast to be in the 40's and 50's, and blustery north winds are expected for 36 hours after the front moves through.

Veterans Day: Another pretty day with sunny skies and a high near 75°. Winds will be light from the east.

Tonight: Clouds will be on the increase with a low around 53° with wind becoming calm.

Thursday: Mostly sunny with a high of 81°. Wind will be S at 5-10 mph.

Thursday night: A low of 58° and partly cloudy skies with light S-SE breezes.

Friday: Maybe some drizzle in the morning, then mostly sunny for the afternoon and 77°. Winds will be E at 5-10 mph.

Friday Night: Mostly cloudy with a low near 62° and SE wind at 5-10 mph.

It's Veteran's Day

The honorable service of our area Veteran's was recognized this morning on Lampasas Courtyard Square, as the same was done all over our country.



The recognition of Veteran's began as a National Holiday in 1954, though it had begun much earlier as recognition of Armistice Day after the war in 1947.

In Lampasas all of the banks and public offices are closed in observance of the day and several veterans and officials were gathered for a brief event at the bandstand.

Lampasas City Council

The regular session of the Lampasas City Council was held on Monday.

Some clarification was agreed to by the Council on rules for golf cart usage and also riding mowers. You can use them on City streets, but only if you are using them within two miles of home or wherever they are usually parked. There was also agreement to a rezoning of 10 acres of land in Sunrise Hills. The acreage is part of a 100 acre plot. The 10 acres had been rezoned from Ag to Commercial at one time and the owners wanted it changed back to Ag.

The work on Ave. E continues. The project cost some \$676 thousand and will, when finished, be a welcome change to that street and area.

A couple of big ticket items were approved by Council. Some \$409 thousand for a new radio system for the Police Dept. and \$432,788 for a new "Vac" truck for the water and sewer Dept.

Coronavirus Update

According to the Texas Tribune,

The State of Texas now has over 1 million confirmed cases of Covid-19. The medical experts say the number could be much higher, due to lack of testing for so many Texans. Yesterday the state reported 10,865 new cases, and over 6000 Texans are hospitalized with the virus, which according to the Texas Tribune is a little more than half of what it was this summer. CNN reports that if Texas was its own country, it would be in the top 10 countries for confirmed cases.

All around the area, some schools are shifting to remote learning due to confirmed cases and quarantined individuals, and activities are being cancelled. The football game between Copperas Cove & Ellison high schools for tomorrow has been postponed and not rescheduled. In nearby Gatesville ISD, all classes and all extracurricular activities have been cancelled. This includes the playoff game Friday between Gatesville & Carthage in Athens. Gatesville recorded a total of 17 cases, 12 students and 5 staff members. At this time the district has 31 active cases, 11 being high school students and 6 cases are teachers. Multiple players and coaches have had close contact with people with confirmed cases, and have to quarantine.

All Gatesville ISD schools will be closed from Thursday-Monday. Thursday and Friday will be student and staff holidays that will be made up during the spring semester. Monday will be a virtual learning day.

No meals will be provided Thursday through Monday.

Locally, Lampasas County is up to 453 total cases with 21 active cases.

FDA Approves Use of Covid-19 Treatment

According to Governor Abbott's website, on Monday, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized the immediate use of the first medical treatment developed for people who contract COVID-19. An antibody drug by Eli Lilly & Co., called bamlanivimab, has been shown to improve the symptoms of people who contract the virus and prevent hospitalizations.

Governor Greg Abbott yesterday announced that the State of Texas has prepared allocation plans to swiftly distribute medicines and vaccines that are now becoming available to treat COVID-19.

The FDA said the drug is authorized for patients at high risk of progressing to severe COVID-19, including people 65 and older, or who have certain pre-existing medical conditions.

Lilly is expected to immediately ship approximately 80,000 doses across the country, including Texas, at no cost to the states. Lilly should have up to one million doses by the end of the year.

Similar to the Lilly antibody treatment, Regeneron Pharmaceuticals Inc. also has requested FDA emergency use authorization of its own COVID-19 antibody medical treatment to treat patients before they become seriously ill and aid in reducing hospitalizations, with an announcement of the FDA's decision expected soon. This is the same antibody drug that President Donald Trump took to quickly recover from COVID-19 last month.

The federal government has agreed to buy hundreds of thousands of doses of the two new treatment drugs and will be in charge of allocating supplies to the states, which will in turn determine distribution to hospitals and healthcare facilities. It is likely that the doses will be allocated to states and U.S. territories based on their share

The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) has already developed a Vaccine Distribution Plan and is working with health care providers to enroll in their Immunization Program to be eligible to administer these vaccines once available. Over 2,500 providers have already enrolled in the program. DSHS formed an Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel to develop vaccine allocation strategies.
