## The Weather



The High yesterday 41° The Low this morning 23°

**Today:** Increasing clouds with a 20% chance of rain after 4pm. The high will be near 47° with a S wind at 5-10 mph.

**Tonight:** Cloudy with a low near 36° and a 30% chance of rain very early tomorrow morning. Light S wind becoming S-SW after midnight.

According to the forecasters, light precipitation is expected to develop mainly over Central Texas this evening, and temperatures should be warm enough that it will all be rain. However there is an outside chance that you will see sleet in the area.

**Thursday:** Cloudy with a 40% chance of rain before 1pm. Then gradually becoming mostly sunny with a high near 53°. Wind becoming N at 5-10 mph in the morning. A weak cold front should move through the area Thursday morning, with rain chances ending after the front goes through. However, Thursday afternoon may see another round of precipitation.

**Thursday Night:** A 20% chance of rain early, then mostly clear with a low near 32°. N-NW wind at 5-10 mph.

**Friday:** Sunny with a high near 59°, and N-NW wind near 5 mph.

## Deputies Save Family From Fire

**Early Tuesday morning** a 911 call was made to the Lampasas County Sheriff's Office about a house fire in the 400 block of E. 5<sup>th</sup> St. from Richard Achord. The 911 call was transferred to the LPD so that the Lampasas Fire Dept. could be dispatched. After a few minutes the dispatcher decided to assist LPD in toning out the fire department.



At the same time, LCSO Deputies Justin Wilson, Calvin Wilcox and Rhett Levingston were at the Sheriff Dept. on their dinner break and working on reports. When notified of the house fire directly behind the Sheriff's Dept., they immediately exited the side door and made the decision to run there instead of driving.

When they arrived at the house on fire, Lampasas Police Dept. officer Garret Bradley also arrived. The officers entered the home to see if anyone was inside. Mrs. Julie Lane, 78, was found

sleeping on a chair in the living room. Her husband, Orville Lane, 74 was found sleeping in a bedroom in the back of the house. The deputies were able to get them outside, as well as rescue their pet Chihuahua.

There were no injuries to anyone involved. The Lampasas Fire Dept. fought the fire, and the cause of the fire is still under investigation.

## County Commissioners Meet

**The Lampasas County Commissioners** met on Tuesday November 12<sup>th</sup> at 9am.

During the public comments section, Kathy Crawford spoke to the Commissioners about creating a yearly calendar for market days. This would include creating monthly events on the Square with vendors and different types of music. Ms. Crawford will be talking with the Courtyard Square Assn. to see if they can help arrange and schedule events. The Commissioners liked the idea of utilizing the square and will hear more about the project at a later date.

Approval was given to abandon a plat of land belonging to the county in Adamsville. Robert McCroy the owner of the land wanted to have this issue addressed.

Approval was given to a change order for the Jail Project in the amount of \$2943.20 for a low voltage conduit for the 911 communication board at the new jail.

Approval was given for the sale of surplus property. Included is a freightliner truck, electronics, computers, printers, cattle guards, miscellaneous office equip and more. These items will be sold on govdeals.com.

Approval was given for Pattillo, Brown & Hill to conduct an annual audit on the county finances.

Approval was given for the final plat for the KT Milam subdivision.

Approval was given for budget amendments.

There was discussion on creating a sign on the northwest flower bed by the courthouse with letters 4 feet tall to bring in more tourism.

## City Council Notes



**The Lampasas City Council** met yesterday for a regular meeting at 7pm in the City Council Chambers.

There were no citizen or public comments.

A discussion was held concerning the curb & gutter work in the 400 block of S. Chestnut St. While there apparently is not enough in the budget at the moment, an agreement was made with the church to go ahead with the curb & gutter and the city will reimburse them when they do have the funds in the next budget cycle. The cost is not to exceed \$20,000.

Approval was given for All Seasons to replace the HVAC unit at the Hostess House at a cost of \$4800.

Approval was given to H & H Tree Service to install and remove Christmas Lights at WM Brook Park at a cost of \$30,000.

Approval was given to a 60 HP Gardner Denver blower unit in the amount of \$10,156 for the pre treatment plant.



## Students Visit Lampasas County Museum

Ten students from Learning Steady Academy, instructor Marilinda Walters, and two of the children's parents toured the Lampasas County Museum's exhibition “My Kind of Gal: Lampasas County Women in the Military” on Veterans Day. Exhibition curator Boyce Cabaniss led the tour and discussed the history of women in the United States Armed Forces as well as the contributions of Lampasas women in the military.

Students were encouraged to invite friends and relatives who have served to fill out the museum's information forms for its Veterans Project binders, a compendium of Lampasas-connected veterans. Mr. Cabaniss also asked students to save letters and diaries from their families as these constitute first-hand accounts of events throughout history. To illustrate his point, he read a portion of a letter from PFC A.C. Hewgley, Jr., to his future wife, Ethelyne Alexander, who became a 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant in the U.S. Army and a registered nurse. The letter was written during World War II around the time the United States bombed Japan and offers a soldier's perspective on the war. The Lampasas County Museum is actively collecting letters and
