The Weather



Today: Skies will be mostly sunny with a high temperature near 83°, and a S wind near 10-20 mph with 25 mph gusts possible.

District Court Notes



Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on November 12th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 21 cases were brought to the court with 14 cases involving men, and 7 cases involving women. There were 6 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 2 cases for less than a gram, 2 cases for 1-4 grams, and 2 cases for 4-200 grams. There were 2 DWI cases.

There were 2 cases for evading arrest. There was one case each for theft of service, criminal mischief, one for engaging in organized criminal activity and one for debit/credit card abuse. There were 2 cases each of assault on a family member, and indecency w/ child sexual contact, one case for arson and one case for injury to a child/elderly person.

Of the cases heard, 8 were settled with Breann Wherry of Brownwood receiving 2 days county jail plus fines and court costs for possession of a controlled substance/PG2 less than a gram. Michael Paul Dunlap saw his charge of arson dismissed. Priscilla Freasier of San Antonio, on the charge of DWI w/ child under 15 in the car saw the charge dropped to a class B misdemeanor and was sentenced to 2 years probation plus costs and fines. On the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram Chayo Boy Rendon was sentenced to 12 months state jail w/credit for days served. On the charge of evading arrest, Rendon was sentenced to 6 years TDCJ w/credit for time served. Rendon was also sentenced to 6 years TDCJ for assault on a family/household member w/ credit for time served. Makenzie Munoz was sentenced to 3 years probation for engaging in organized criminal activity and was sentenced to 3 years probation plus costs and fines. She was also sentenced to 3 years probation plus costs and fines on a second charge, credit or debit card abuse.

The rest of the cases were reset or had dates set for jury trials.

Redistricting the County

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court will be holding a public hearing today in the first floor conference room of the county annex building at 11am. This meeting is to address Lampasas County redistricting. Following the public hearing will be a called Lampasas County Commissioners meeting at 11:30am at the same location to take possible action on redistricting.

Coronavirus Update

Statewide, according to the DSHS, there were 945 new and 168 probable new cases on November 15th, along with 9 deaths. There were also 2,653 Texans in the hospital with Covid-19. Locally, the DSHS dashboard for cases shows 0 new confirmed cases in Lampasas County on November 15th, and 11 confirmed cases in the last 14 days. The state estimates Lampasas County to have 20 active cases at this time.

The I-14 Corridor

Congressional designation of the Interstate 14 Corridor across Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Georgia became a reality Monday with the presidential signing of the \$1.2 trillion bipartisan Infrastructure bill.

The newly designated I-14 route runs from Midland-Odessa across Central Texas then to Alexandria, Louisiana, Laurel, Mississippi, Montgomery, Alabama, and Columbus, Georgia before terminating at Augusta, Georgia.

I-14 will be built primarily by incrementally upgrading existing highways in each of the states.

"We understand that building I-14 will require billions of dollars and many years to complete but we are on our way," said John Thompson, chairman of the I-14 Gulf Coast Strategic Highway Coalition which has been building grassroots support for I-14 over the past decade.

"The I-14 system will improve connectivity between regions, provide freight movement efficiency, link important military facilities and strategic seaports, create a high elevation alternative for coastal sections of I-10 that are prone to flooding, and spur economic development opportunities along the 1,300 mile path," he said.

The first sections of the I-14 corridor in Texas was approved by Congress in 2015 and a 25-mile section of freeway from Killeen/Fort Hood to I-35 in Central Texas became I-14 in 2017.

The new bill expands the Texas designation to include San Angelo and Midland-Odessa. It also includes four north-south future interstate spurs that will connect I-14 to Interstate 10 and serve the Port of Corpus Christi, the Port of Houston and the ports at Beaumont and Port Arthur. It also adds a north south spur connecting to the Port of Gulfport, Mississippi. The designation includes a future interstate loop at Bryan-College Station designated Interstate 214.

A significant benefit of providing interstate linkage between a dozen military facilities served by the I-14 corridor is that these connections will add to the military value of each of these
