The forecasters say the mist should clear out by this afternoon as winds increase. Our area should see gusty winds around the noon hour as a cold front approaches. There is also a chance a dryline will set up near Lampasas bringing much needed rain and a few storms. The rain should all be out of the area by tomorrow morning and a sunny, cooler day is expected. A stronger front is expected early Friday morning.

Other important items on the agenda included the adoption of the fireworks order, which prohibits skyrockets with sticks or missiles with fins from being ignited in incorporated areas of Lampasas County. Defying this order will result in a class C misdemeanor.

Finally, the last item on the agenda was a discussion about the current state of the new jail undergoing construction. The project, started in 2017, is anticipated to be finished once health inspections can be held for the kitchen. There is no set inspection date as of yet, but staff should have a date by the next meeting. The meeting was then adjourned.

Coronavirus Update

Dr. Hay shared with Lampasas Radio this morning that Lampasas County has 550 total cases, up from 538 yesterday. There are 63 active cases up from 51 yesterday. The State of Texas saw 6,576 new cases yesterday and 8,353 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19.

Lometa ISD Receives Grant



The Lometa Independent School District will install new play-

ground equipment at the school, thanks to a \$24,548 grant from the Lower Colorado River Authority and Hamilton County Electric Cooperative.

The Community Development Partnership Program grant, along with \$6,340 in matching funds, will be used to replace outdated playground equipment at Lometa public schools. Some of the equipment, which is about 25 years old, can no longer be used.

"The new playground will create opportunities for students to engage in play, fitness and group activities, and help develop their social skills," said David Fisher, Lometa ISD superintendent.

Fisher said the new playground will be on a campus shared by high school, middle school and elementary students.

The school provides the only playground in the small, rural community of Lometa. The next nearest playground is in Lampasas, about 10 miles away.

"We're thankful to LCRA for helping us purchase new and safer playground equipment for our students and our community," Fisher said. "It would have been very difficult for us to do on our own." (cont'd on back)

The Burn Ban is in Effect

Lometa ISD serves 292 students from pre-kindergarten to 12th grade in a community of about 900 people. The equipment will be available to the public when not in use by the school in the evenings and weekends.

District court notes



Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on November 20th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 16 cases were brought to the court, 11 of them involved men and 5 involved women. Felix Ybarra of Lampasas failed to appear on the charge of possession/controlled substance PG1 less than a gram in a drug free zone. Domonique Gatlin of Bellmead failed to appear on the charge of burglary of a habitation. Eddie Cruz of Lampasas also failed to appear on the charges of possession/controlled substance/PG1 less than a gram and assault on family/household member.

There were 9 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1; 7 for under 1 gram, with one in a drug free zone, and 2 for 4-200 grams. There was 1 case for engaging in organized criminal activity.

There were 2 cases for burglary of a habitation. Crimes causing personal harm included 3 cases of assault/ family/household member and one case for indecency with a child/sexual contact.

Of the 10 cases presented to the court, one case was settled with Ty McCoy pleading guilty to one of his two charges of assault of a family/household member. He was sentenced to 5 years probation plus court costs and a \$2000 fine. The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date
