The Weather



The high yesterday 61° The low this morning 52°

Today: A chance of rain and thunderstorms before 10am, then rain and possibly a thunderstorm between 10am and 4pm, then rain after 4pm. High near 56°. Northeast wind 5 to 10 mph becoming north northwest in the afternoon. Winds could gust as high as 20 mph. Chance of precipitation is 90%. New rainfall amounts between a half and three quarters of an inch possible.

Tonight: Rain likely and possibly a thunderstorm before midnight, then a slight chance of rain between midnight and 2am. Cloudy, with a low around 40°. North northwest wind 5 to 10 mph. Chance of precipitation is 70%. New precipitation amounts between a quarter and half of an inch possible.

Sunday: Mostly cloudy, then gradually becoming sunny, with a high near 57°. North northwest wind 5 to 15 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Sunday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 33°. North northwest wind around 15 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph.

Monday: Sunny, with a high near 51°. North wind 10 to 15 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph.

Monday Night: Mostly clear, with a low around 26°. North northwest wind 5 to 10 mph becoming southwest after midnight.

Dear High School Parents/Guardians,

By order of the Lampasas County Health Authority, we will transition the Lampasas High School campus to remote only instruction starting 11/27/2020 until 12/7/2020. This decision was based on the COVID active case counts for students and staff on the campus having reached 22 as of 11/27/2020. We ask that you, as always, watch for symptoms of COVID-19 and seek medical advice if any are displayed:

- o Temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth;
- o Sore throat;
- o New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (or, for students with a chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline);
- o Loss of taste or smell
- o Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain; or
- o New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever.

The Blotter



The Lampasas Police Dept. Blotter for Friday shows a total of 33 calls for the day. The first incident to be reported was for shots fired in the 200 block of S Arnold St before the sun was up. At 10:06 AM, fraud was reported in the 200 block of E 2nd St, followed shortly after by a suspicious vehicle reported in the 300 block of E 4th St.

As we get farther into the day, the afternoon brings us a reported harassment at 1:11 PM in the 300 block of N Ridge St. At 2:06 PM, a domestic disturbance was reported in the 900 block of E Central Texas Expressway. Less than 40 minutes later, a burglary of a motor vehicle was called in the 100 block of EE Ohnmeiss Dr. At 4:01 PM in the 200 block of E 2nd St, a disturbance was reported. Only two minutes later, a theft was reported in the 800 block of South Key Ave.

The evening brings us a disturbance at 4:53 PM, reported in the 200 block of E 3rd St. At 5:22 PM, a reckless driver was reported in the 900 block of Old Georgetown Rd at 6 PM. The last call for the day was made at 9:46 PM for a reported disturbance in the 1000 block of Mclean St.

The Lampasas County Sheriff's Blotter for Friday shows 25 total reports. The day starts in Evant, who only had one report for fish & game, at 12:47 AM. Lampasas had a busy day, started their calls at 12:55 AM with a traffic stop. At 8:24 AM, a suspicious person was reported. At 10:18 AM, an animal problem was called in, followed by a reckless driver only an hour later. At 11:20 AM, a medical call was made.

As noon comes along, an identity theft was reported at 2:20 PM. At 4 PM, a disturbance was called in. About 15 minutes later, a civil matter was reported.

The evening's first call took place at 5:08 PM, with an open door/gate call. At 5:25 there was an onsite call, followed shortly after by a reckless driver. A traffic stop was made at 6:01 PM. At 8:39 PM, a 911 contact was made, and another at 10:22 PM. An assault was reported at 10:24 PM, and an agency assist at 10:33 PM. Lampasas ended their day with a civil matter call at 10:54 PM.

Kempner had only two incidents, one at 2:42 AM for mental health, and another at 6:35 PM for trespassing.

Copperas Cove only had one incident taking place at 8:49 PM for a traffic hazard.

Williamson County Judge Violates his Own Stay-At-Home Order

From Texas Tribune: Williamson County Judge Bill Gravell pleaded guilty to a misdemeanor Tuesday for violating his own stay-at-home order this spring and will pay a \$1,000 fine, court documents show.

During the stay-at-home order in April, Gravell was caught on camera going to his grandson's birthday party wearing firefighting equipment from the county, an act for which a fire chief later apologized because he provided a suit to the judge that he could "not provide everyone."

The order, issued in March, ceased all public and private gatherings outside a household or apartment unit, closed all nonessential businesses and asked residents not to travel on public transportation

unless it was for essential activities. Residents faced threats of jail time or fines if they left their homes for anything other than essential business.

The incident prompted the appointment of a special prosecutor, Milam County District Attorney Bill Torrey, and an investigation by the Texas Rangers.

Torrey's office said it could not comment on the case since it was unresolved. Bill Hines, Gravell's lawyer, said that Gravell is the only person in the county to be prosecuted for violating the stay-at-home order.

"He does accept responsibility," Hines said. "He made a mistake as a grandfather. He's paying the maximum penalty for that."

In exchange for the guilty plea, the special prosecutor is dropping two other charges related to the incident of abuse of official capacity and official oppression.

Williamson County, located north of Austin, has had just over 1,100 COVID-19 cases in the last two weeks.

"While I carry the heavy public burden of guiding the policies that best protect our citizens, I am also a husband, father and grandfather," Gravell said in a statement. "It was in this role that I visited my 5-year-old grandson on his birthday. Pawpaw Bill made an error in judgement that County Judge Gravell deeply regrets."

FEMA Letter Not Invalidated

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security confirmed last week that the so-called "FEMA" access letter issued in May for designated essential workers traveling during the COVID pandemic remain valid and in effect despite bearing the signature of former CISA Director Christopher Krebs who was ousted by the White House last week.

"The original letter signed by Director Krebs as the Director of CISA is still in effect until another CISA Director or authorized person either reissues or terminates the current letter," said David Villyard, NCC COMM-ISAC Federal Chair of DHS' CISA Integrated Operations Division.

As local authorities throughout Texas increasingly struggle with the raging pandemic and expand curfews or other travel limitations, journalists and engineers working for FCC-licensed stations and traveling for work should be sure to have a copy of the letter in their possession, along with a legal photo ID.

While commonly referred to as a "FEMA" letter, the agency of jurisdiction is actually called the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA).
