The Weather

The cooler and drier airmass brought overnight temperatures down near freezing this morning, and the north winds are expected to continue through the morning diminishing through the afternoon. The abundant sunshine will allow temperatures to reach into the upper 40's and low 50's in our area today, however temperatures tonight are expected to be in the 20's. The next cold front headed our way will clear our area sometime Wednesday morning. Thursday will be the coldest day with accompanying blustery winds.

Today: Look for sunny skies and a high temperature near 53°. Winds will be N-NW at 5-15 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear and a cold night with the low temperature near 27°. Winds will be light from the SW.

Tuesday Sunny with a high near 59°. The wind will be SW at 5-15 mph with possible gusts of 25 mph.

Tuesday Night: Mostly clear skies with a low near 38°. Winds will be S at 5-15mph shifting W in the night. Wind could gust up to 20 mph.

Wednesday: Sunny with a high near 54°. Winds will be from the N-NW at 5-15 mph gusting as high as 25 mph. shifting to the E-NE in the afternoon.

Wednesday Night: Mostly clear with a low near 31°, and the N-NW wind continues near 10 mph gusting to 20 mph.

High School Going Remote This Week.

As most have heard, Lampasas High School will be conduction remote-only classes through this week. Lampasas Radio confirmed that the high school will have no practices or games during this time. Sports for the other campuses remain as scheduled. Students are urged to contact teachers daily so they don't fall behind in their studies.

Dr. Rascoe shared this with Lampasas Radio:

"We are working closely with our health authority daily monitoring the spread of the virus on each campus and within our community. Our high school campus experienced a significant increase in active cases recently, both students (12) and staff (11), that exceeded a 2% overall threshold that had been established for any campus at the beginning of the year. We hope to make a decision on next week's status of the high school by this coming Friday once we have more information on the status of the spread of the virus on the campus. Right now, our other campuses are proceeding with normal operations due to the active cases being lower and well below the established threshold.

Dr. Hay shared with Lampasas Radio this morning that the County now has 574 total cases with 49 active cases, and 1 county resident in the hospital. The State of Texas saw 6,041 new cases yesterday and 8,634 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19.

1. PROTECT PEOPLE

2. PROTECT PETS

Cover cold sensitive plants to protect them from the dangerous

Cover pipes and allow outdoor faucets to slowly drip to prevent from freezing and breaking.



5. PRACTICE FIRE SAFETY



Use safe heating sources indoors. Do not use fuel-burning devices such as grills; they release carbon monoxide, which is a deadly gas. Also, make sure to use space heaters according to their instructions and be attentive to
