According to the NWS, Eastland, northwest of here was the coldest spot this morning with a temperature of 21°. The forecasters say a cool and breezy day is expected today as strong southerly winds will bring the temperature up to near 60°. However, another cold front is expected to move through overnight tonight. The cold airmass is expected to be strong enough to see temperatures drop significantly, and the high temperatures in many areas may occur in the morning.

Today: Mostly sunny and the high should make it to near 59°. Wind will be S at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph. **Tonight:** Mostly clear skies and a low around 40°. The wind will become light and variable.

Wednesday: It will be mostly sunny and up to 56° with a slight chance of showers in the morning. Winds will be NW at 5-15 mph with possible gusts of 25 mph.

Overnight Wednesday: Partly cloudy and 31°. Winds will be N-NW at 10-15 mph.

Thursday: Mostly sunny and a high temperature near 50°. Winds will continue from the N-NW at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph

Thursday Overnight: Mostly cloudy with a low near 30°. Winds will be N-NW at 5-10 mph.

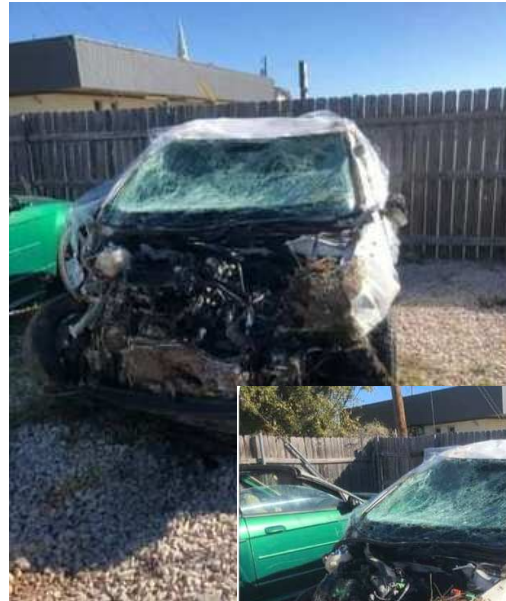

State Budget Better than Expected.

According to a story by Mitchell Ferman/ Texas Tribune, Despite staggering pandemic losses, Texas budget forecast better than expected, state comptroller says. Despite "historic declines," state lawmakers will have more money to work with in the upcoming legislative session than Comptroller Glenn Hegar expected over the summer, he said Monday. But Hegar did not outline specifics as state coffers continue to suffer from the economic recession spurred by the coronavirus pandemic.

Sales tax revenues, by far the largest part of the state budget, fell by 4.8% in the second half of the 2020 fiscal year compared with the same stretch last year, Hegar said. It was a much softer hit than he anticipated, thanks to Texans staying home and spending money on "staycations instead of vacations."

Other revenue streams, such as taxes related to alcohol, hotel occupancy, and oil and gas, were down more than 40% in the same period this year compared with last, Hegar told lawmakers Monday during a Legislative Budget Board meeting at the Capitol.

"Revenues remain down significantly relative to a year ago, and well below what we expected to collect when the Legislature wrapped up work on the budget in 2019," Hegar said.

Legislative budget writers decide how much money will be allocated for large state expenses like how much school districts get, how well health care programs are funded, which transportation projects get built and what amount state law enforcement gets based on how much the comptroller says will be available during the next two-year budget cycle, which runs from September 2021 through August 2023. Hegar will likely unveil that number as the session nears.

On Monday, Hegar presented virtually to some of the state's political leaders, including Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick and House Speaker Dennis Bonnen, who co-chair the budget board and who appeared in person at the Capitol along with eight other colleagues from both chambers.
