The Weather



The High yesterday 60° The Low this morning 35°

After a cool morning tomorrow, temperatures will climb to above normal before the next cold front makes it to our area. Areas west of I-35 will experience the warmest temperatures. In spite of recent rainfall, vegetation has had several days to dry out. The combination of very warm temperatures, low humidity and winds may create some fire weather concerns.

Today: A very pretty day with sunny skies and a high of 62°. Winds will be from the NW at 5 mph becoming E in the afternoon.

Tonight: Wind will be E-SE and light, shifting to the S-SW after midnight. The low temperature will be near 38°.

Tuesday: Sunny and 73°. Winds will be S-SW at 5-15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Overnight Tuesday: Winds will be W at 5 mph becoming N after midnight. Skies will be mostly clear with a low near 40°.

Wednesday: Mostly sunny with a high near 67°. Winds will be N at 5mph shifting to the E in the afternoon.

Overnight Wednesday: Mostly cloudy with a low near 47°. Winds will be light and from the E becoming S after midnight.

Badgers win Regional Semi 66-44 over Needville

Now it's on to Regionals vs Liberty Hill



The Badgers trip to the San Antonio Alamodome was a big deal for the team and fans. There was a huge crowd on hand as the teams and fans lined up across the field from each other. And soon enough the Bluejays were getting a sample of what the Badgers were capable of.

The Jays, usually depending on the skilled running of Ashton Stredick, found that

didn't work well and went to the air. The Badger defense was more than capable of shutting that down too, as shown by the pix (right) of Daunte Cuffie slapping down a Needville pass. The Badger defense held their opponents to 12 of 35 in passing with 3 TDs and the running game was able to get 3 TDs with their 443 yards gained. Though the defense played very well against the always high scoring Needville offense, that offense was no match



for the Badgers as they just kept on scoring. was outstanding, the high scoring Badger offense. This was the second time this year that the Badgers were able to score 66 in a game, though there was a 63 and a 59 and a few 56s.

Individually, Jaylon Porter was the high scoring receiver for the Badgers, catching 7 of Ace Whitehead's passes for 3 TDs. Brenton Webb caught 2 and scored on one of them. Ace Whitehead himself put in an amazing game, throwing the ball 21 times with 18 completions, an 86% completion rate. He carried the ball himself 13 times for 80 yards and 2 TDs, and he kicked a field goal and several extra points. He was probably the player of the game for the vast majority of pickers. Most Badger fans were also thrilled with the performances of the several pass receivers and runners on the Badger offense. Daunte Cuffie may have put in his best performance yet in the game, rushing 6 times for 69 yards and 2 TDs, as well as playing lights out defense in the game. Steady rusher Jack Jerome also shined with 21 carries for 69 yards and 2 TDs.

The Badgers will advance to the Regional championship on Saturday against Liberty Hill. The game will be played in Cedar Park at Gupton Stadium at 2pm.

Liberty Hill is Comeback Story of the Year

The Liberty Hill Panthers have been the top team in the district for years it seems. Last year they went on to win state. It has been the story of the big school always winning, and Lampasas fans were glad to hear that the school had finally been tabbed to move up to 5A status and out of Lampasas' 4A district.



But, there was this last year to contend with. Lampasas and other schools in the district were surprised when Liberty Hill didn't fare well in district and lost to Canyon Lake, Fredericksburg and Lampasas, and finishing 2-3 and in 3rd place. Most of us were tempted to say, "The King is Dead."

That didn't turn out to be the case. Liberty Hill went into the playoffs with a renewed determination to prove they could go back to the championship games. (cont'd on back)
