Lampasas High School Back to In-Person Learning

Dr. Chane Rascoe shared with Lampasas Radio this morning that the case counts at Lampasas High School are down significantly, with only 4 currently active students and/or staff on the high school campus. Those 4 are under quarantine and should return very soon. "Operations are back to normal on the campus, and we are monitoring the issue closely on all our campuses." As Dr. Rascoe shared with Lampasas Radio last week, "We are working closely with our health authority daily monitoring the spread of the virus on each campus and within our community."

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on December 4th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt.



Altogether 33 cases were brought to the court, 24 of them involved men and 9 involved women. Joshua Delacruz of Lampasas failed to appear on the charge of invasive visual recording. Aairon Mathews of Temple failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams.

There were 7 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1; 4 for under 1 gram, three cases for 1-4 grams and 2 cases for possession of PG2, one less than a gram, one for 1-4 grams. There were 4 cases for DWI 3rd or more.

There was 1 case for engaging in organized criminal activity. There were 2 cases for burglary of a habitation by the same defendant. There were 2 cases for theft \$2500-\$30,000, 2 cases for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, 3 cases of debit/credit cards abuse (with 2 for the same defendant), and one case of evading arrest w/a vehicle. There was one case for abandoning/endangering a child, and one for accident causing injury.

Crimes causing personal harm included one case each for aggravated assault, deadly conduct, assaulting a public servant, injury to a child, invasive visual recording and one case for indecency with a child/sexual contact.

Of the 33 cases presented to the court, 3 defendants settled 6 cases. Roy Sewell plead guilty to possession of controlled substance/PG2 less than a gram and for that count, saw his probation continued. On the count of DWI 3rd or more, the charge was reduced to DWI 2nd, a misdemeanor, and Mr. Sewell was sentenced to 1 year in county jail, probated, plus costs and fees. On the charge of assaulting a public servant, Mr. Sewell plead guilty and was sentenced to 10 years probation plus costs. Kristal Alderson of Lampasas plead guilty to abandon/endanger child/criminal negligence and for that count received 5 years probation with ISF as a condition plus costs and fees. On the count of accident involving injury, Ms. Alderson received 5 years probation plus costs, restitution and ISD as a condition. Angie Alvarado, of Killeen, plead guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG2/1-4grams and saw one count waived. The remainders of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date

It's the Giving Time of Year and Food Banks are Struggling

Food banks across Texas are projecting food shortages in coming months due to the end of three key federal and state programs that have helped them respond to high demand during the coronavirus pandemic and its accompanying recession.

According to a November survey by the U.S. Census Bureau, more than 2.5 million households in Texas either sometimes or often did not have enough food to eat in the week prior to the poll.

The worries about a looming food shortage come as two main unemployment programs that significantly expand jobless assistance — and a federal moratorium on evictions — are set to expire at the end of December. If Congress doesn't act on another pandemic stimulus package, many Texans will lose at least some of their unemployment benefits.

This also comes as Texas faces another major surge in coronavirus infections.

The main federal program that is ending provided around \$100 million dollars in food to Texas food banks in 2020, according to Feeding Texas calculations. The Food Purchase and Distribution Program was created to help farmers affected by the trade war between President Donald Trump's administration and China and Europe. This ended up helping hunger organizations, as the food bought by the U.S. Department of Agriculture from these farmers ended up being distributed to food banks across the country.

Texas food banks are also concerned by a 40% cut in funding of a Texas Department of Agriculture program that buys surplus produce from farmers — fruits and vegetables that are of good quality but don't fill the standards of major retail stores — and distributes it to food banks.



Also due to COVID-19, food banks have lost volunteers, but have also had to decrease the capacity of their working areas. Locally, Lampasas Radio received the following from the Lampasas Mission: "Lampasas Mission would like to thank the generous people, churches, schools and businesses of Lampasas for their support in providing Thanksgiving boxes for the needy of the community. You generously donated more than 6,000 lbs of food that was distributed on November 23 and 24. Thank you! May we ask for you help for one more item: The Mission will be closed from December 18 until January 5 to give our dedicated volunteers a much needed rest and holiday. We ask that you do not bring donations during this time as there will not be anyone available to receive or process the donations. Thank you for your cooperation."
