The Weather

A strong cold front will push through the region this afternoon. Winds will become westerly this afternoon and Northerly this evening. We will have much cooler temperatures late this afternoon. Freezing precipitation is not expected in our area, but is expected to remain NW of our area.

Today: A pretty start to the day with Partly sunny skies and a high of 78°. Winds will be from the W-SW at 5-15 mph becoming N in the afternoon. Winds could gust to 20 mph.

Tonight: an 80% chance of rain possible after 9pm, with a low temperature near 36°. Wind will be N at 15-20 mph gusting to 30 mph.

Badgers Win Again 49-34

headed to the State Semi-finals on Friday.**

Badger fans went in mass to Cedar Park on Saturday for the showdown with their old nemesis, Liberty Hill, and came away with a convincing victory. No it wasn't the kind of lop-sided win the Badgers are used to, but it was against a revived and determined Liberty Hill team that was tough to the end in this game.

It began with the Badger offense taking the kickoff and after three plays Ace Whitehead's 51 yard TD pass to Michael Murray put the team on the board first. Before long the Badgers had another TD, a pass to Jaylon Porter, and a PAT while Liberty Hill's Panthers could only get a field goal. Porter would catch two more TD passes, one of them by Jason Andrews, by half-time and Ace would run in a short one for another TD. Liberty Hill was able to kick another field goal and score two TDs during that first half and it ended 35-19.

In the second half Liberty Hill came out determined and even after losing the ball on a fumble, they were able to move offensively. Whitehead threw a pass to Brenton Webb for a TD to increase the lead to 42-19, but the Panthers came right back with a quick answer and it was 42-27 at the end of the third quarter.

In that last period, both teams were able to add another TD and extra point and it was 49-34 at the end.

After an interesting up and down season, the Panthers have put up their footballs for the year while the 13-1 Badgers go on to game number 5 in the State Playoffs, the Semi-finals. The Badgers made it to this level back in 1986 and that's where it ended. Badger fans are beginning to believe this year's team could go all the way.

This next challenge will be the biggest the team has faced. It is against the number 1 team in 4A Division 1 rankings, Carthage.

Carthage, like Lampasas, is more of a passing team, though it could be said that they generally don't put as many points on the scoreboard as Lampasas does.

The game will be played at New Caney on Friday, Dec. 13th, at 7:30pm.

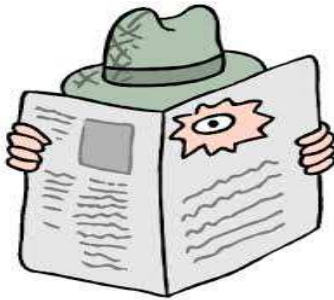

On the agenda was the Treasurer's Quarterly Report and various monthly reports.

Also considered were; amendments and/or revisions to the county Utility Installation Permit procedures, Grounds and preventative maintenance at the new jail, approval of 3 bores on CR 3300 by Kempner Water Supply, Texas Parks & Wildlife Interlocal agreement renewal, The Burn Ban, Subdivision Rules, an Interlocal agreement between Lampasas and Mills county for Inmate housing and a change order for the 2017 Jail Project regarding purchase and installation of ceramic tile for the sheriff's office and the sheriff's administrative assistant's office instead of the scheduled VCS tile.

Lampasas County Commissioners also have a called meeting this afternoon at 1:30 pm. On the agenda for the called meeting is consideration of (1) department head (2) a presentation from the University of Texas at Arlington for the Texas Local Technical Assistance Program related to an overview of workforce development, technical assistance and training offered by TxLTAP at no cost to the county .

Lampasas Badgers (13-1) are heading to the Semi-finals vs Carthage (14-0) .

There are now just 4 teams left in the Division Playoffs.

This week, while Lampasas plays Carthage, Springtown plays La Vega. Next week two of these teams play for the State Division 1 Championship.

Badger quarterback Ace Whitehead, nominated for Mr. Texas Football, is ranked as the number 3 passer in 4A Division 1 football for the entire season. He has thrown for almost 3900 yards and 51 TDs at this point, has 237 completions of 331 attempts, well over 71% .

Carthage's QB, Kai Horton is listed as number 20, with 1604 yards and 21 TD total and a 62% completion rate, however he only played 7 games rather than Ace Whitehead's 14 games.

Of Carthage's total 36 TDs in their 14 game season so far, 23 of them came from passing the ball. Their main receiver is a senior (#3) Kelvontay Dixon who made 11 TDs, another 8 TDs were by Mason Courtney, a 185 lb running back. While Carthage is a passing team, like Lampasas, the Badger's season history has often been described as "explosive."

Badger fans will likely be just as explosive in the New Caney Stadium on Friday as they cheer on their team.
