The Weather



The High yesterday 40° The Low this morning 31°

Clouds are expected to clear late this morning, allowing temperatures to reach the lower 50's by this afternoon. Tonight, mostly clear skies will lead to low temperatures falling into the lower and middle 30's by daybreak Thursday.

Today: Partly Sunny, then clouds burn off for a sunny afternoon with a high near 53°. Calm wind becoming E-SE at 5 mph this morning.

Tonight: Mostly clear with a low near 34° and S-SE wind at 5 mph.

Thursday: Mostly sunny with a high near 59°. Wind will be light form the S-SW becoming S at S at 5-10 mph in the morning.

Thursday Night: A low near 40° and mostly clear skies. Wind will be S-SE near 5 mph becoming SW after midnight.

Friday: Sunny with a high temperature near 69°. Wind will be W-SW at 5-10 mph.

Friday Night: Mostly clear with a low near 42° and W wind near 5 mph.

Saturday: Sunny with a high near 70°. W-NW winds at 5-10 mph becoming S in the afternoon

District Court Notes



Lampasas Courthouse was the site of a 27th District

Court Docket Call on December 6th, 2019. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 60 cases were brought to the court. 51 of them involved men and 9 involved women. There were 4 defendants that failed to appear; Cornelius Dorsey, and Mikael Sanchez each on the charge of possession of a controlled substance less than a gram, and Michael Robinson and Matthew Bowden for unauthorized use of a vehicle. Alva Clayton, who is charged with theft of a firearm, was found to have his bond found insufficient.

There were 21 cases that involved possession of a controlled substance, one for Penalty Group 2, and 20 for Penalty Group 1 with 12 cases for less than a gram, 2 cases for 1-4 grams and 6 cases of 4-200 grams. There were 2 cases of a prohibited substance in a correctional facility. There were 3 cases for DWI 3rd or more.

Felony cases for burglary or theft numbered 9, with 3 for theft of a firearm, 2 for burglary of a habitation, and 4 for burglary of a building. There were 2 cases for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, and 2 cases of evading arrest with a vehicle.

There was 1 forgery case, 1 for credit/debit card abuse, and one for misappropriation of a trust fund.

Crimes causing personal harm included one for assaulting a public servant, 2 for aggravated assault of a family member, and 4 for assaulting a family/household member. There were 4 cases for aggravated sexual assault of a child, or for indecency with a child/ sexual contact, one for indecent exposure, and one for failing to register as a sex offender.

Miscellaneous crimes included one case of unauthorized absence from a correctional facility, 2 for unlawful possession of a firearm by a

felon, and one for harassment by certain persons in a correctional facility.

Of the 60 cases, 7 were decided with Damien Williams of Ft. Worth pleading guilty and sentenced to 375 days of state jail and given credit for 375 days. Angel Sandoval pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams and received 6 years probation plus fines. Kenneth Mask of Lampasas pled guilty to failing to register as a sex offender, for which he received 3 years probation, and also pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance less than a gram, and aggravated sexual assault of a child. He will continue his probation on those charges. James Miles of Kempner was found guilty of assault on a family member, and received 212 days county jail time with 212 days of credit. Donna Carroll Bardin pled guilty to aggaravated assault of a date/ family/household member and received 1 day in county jail w/1 day of credit.

The balance of the cases were reset or had trials scheduled.



Texas Farmers Grow Christmas Cheer

Christmas trees, holly, mistletoe, poinsettias—so many of our Christmas traditions are rooted in agriculture. Literally. And we're lucky to live in a state with diverse agricultural production. Texas farmers grow Christmas trees and poinsettias in addition to our traditional crops like corn, wheat and cotton. Did you know about 150 Texas farmers grow 200,000 Christmas trees annually?

That's right. So when you gather 'round the tree on Christmas morning, you may be celebrating beneath the boughs of a Texas-grown pine.

And what's prettier than poinsettias in dreary December weather? Poinsettias are a popular gift among neighbors, friends and loved ones in November and December—for good reason. The bright red and dark green leaves bring a pop of color and living touch of holiday cheer to homes and businesses.

Once again, Texas growers are help bring you that festive foliage. One facility in East Texas grows around 1 million poinsettias annually, with many other nurseries and greenhouses across the state also busy growing the plants and other seasonal ornamental plants. Although poinsettias may seem finicky, Texas grower Nolan Jeske says they're actually pretty easy to care for. Here's his advice on keeping your poinsettias looking perky all season long.

• Poinsettias don't like cold and are sensitive to temperature fluctuations. Keep them in a warm spot away from doors and drafty windows.

• Don't overwater! This is the most common mistake poinsettia owners make. If it has one, take the plant out of the foil wrapper surrounding the pot before watering. Allow the water to completely drain before placing it back in the foil.

• They need plenty of sunlight. Bright, indirect light is best. Aim for at least eight hours a day.

While Christmas decorations are a sight to behold, nothing is more beautiful than a family enjoying the holidays together. We hope your family enjoys a safe and happy holiday season!
