# The Weather

Clouds are expected to linger in parts of Central Texas today, and the high temperatures will have trouble getting above the mid 50's. Wind chills will also be a factor. The blustery north winds will become light from the E-NE this afternoon. After midnight there is a very slight chance of fog or freezing fog developing. Look for highs in the 40' s& 50'son Tuesday and gusty north winds with the cold front moving through.

**Today**: Look for sunny skies and a high temperature near  $50^{\circ}$ . Winds will be light from the east.

**Tonight**: Increasing clouds with the low temperature near 33°. Winds will be light from the S-SE.

**Tuesday** Mostly cloudy with gradual clearing and a high near 61°. The wind will become gusty from the W-NW in the afternoon with gusts of 25 mph possible.

## **Meetings Monday**

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court met this morning



at 9am in the Commissioner's Courtroom in the Lampasas County Courthouse. The Agenda included; the consent agenda, quarterly and monthly reports from various departments and a Sheriff's Report, accounts payable/ payroll, public comments, invoices for

additional services caused by contractor default and serviced rendered by Haley & Olson PC, a change order for the Jail Project, a bond release request for Cottonwood Mesa, business with the Rural Rail District-Brady Shippers, and, of course, the Jail Project 2017.

**Lampasas City Council** will meet in their chambers in the Calvert Building on  $3^{rd}$  Street this afternoon. A workshop session will convene at 5:30pm and the regular session at 6pm. There will be public hearings and ordinance readings on a Specific Use Permit for property known as 1708 CTE suite 3 to allow for a vapor store, and for 1002 E.  $4^{th}$  St. to allow for a portable storage building. There will be a second reading to amend an oirdinance about fire prevention and protection, routine matters, the city managers operational report, some budgetary business, some looks at quotes for construction of the proposed Skatepark and Campbell Park Pavilion, as well as a few other spending matters. An executive session will go over some financial nformation from a business prospect and presumably some economic development negotiations. Council then has to return to regular session to vote on whatever was discussed in executive session.

# Light at the End of the Tunnel?

The first doses of the long-awaited COVID-19 vaccine hit Texas soil on Monday, and will be arriving this week at health care facilities around Texas



after winning federal approval for emergency use on Friday, nearly a quarter-million doses of the Pfizer vaccine will start being injected into the arms of front-line medical workers who volunteer for the shot. Trucks carrying the doses began pulling out of Pfizer's Michigan manufacturing facility on Sunday, according to news reports.

109 medical facilities are slated to receive the first allocation of 1.4 million doses earmarked for Texas this year, said Chris Van Deusen, spokesman for the Texas Department of State Health Services.

Van Deusen said 19,500 doses will be arriving at four sites Monday: MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, UT Health Austin at the Dell Medical School, Methodist Dallas Medical Center and Wellness 360 at UT Health San Antonio. Another 75,075 doses will be arriving at 19 sites in 12 cities on Tuesday, including facilities in Edinburg, El Paso, San Angelo, Corpus Christi, Galveston, Amarillo and Lubbock, among others. Vaccine doses for the remaining 86 sites will begin shipping later in the week. More vaccines are expected to arrive in Texas the week of Dec. 21, likely including doses from Pfizer and Moderna, whose vaccine is expected to get federal approval by the end of this week, Van Deusen said.

# The Blotter

Meanwhile, some small hospitals are still waiting for their chance to get access to the vaccine. They were left out this week because the first batch was only available in increments of 975 doses, Van Deusen said.

The "first tier" recipients include hospital-based workers who have direct contact with patients; staff of nursing homes or other long-term care facilities who work directly with residents; emergency medical services providers such as paramedics and ambulance drivers; and home health aides who manage "vulnerable and high-risk" patients. Those who get vaccinated will have to get a second dose 19 to 23 days after their first vaccine.

If there are enough doses to go around, a "second tier" of health care workers will also be eligible to be vaccinated, including those who interact with patients in outpatient settings such as doctors' offices; workers in freestanding emergency rooms and urgent care clinics; community pharmacy workers; public health workers who administer COVID-19 tests; mortuary workers such as medical examiners and embalmers; and school nurses.

A shadow over some of the excitement is the fact that so many hospitals and health care workers will still be waiting for the vaccine even as their colleagues in larger cities get inoculated this week.

Because the Pfizer vaccine is only allowed by the company to be ordered in increments of 975, Van Deusen said, smaller hospitals that don't need that many were left off the first round of doses this week. But when the Moderna vaccine becomes available, which officials anticipate before next week, doses may be ordered in batches as small as 100.

It seems there may be light at the end of the tunnel.
