The Weather

The high yesterday 51° This morning's low 28°

The forecasters say it will be a bit warmer today than it was yesterday with highs in the 60° range. Things will cool down again tonight, but not as cold as last night, and we are generally expected to remain above freezing. Tomorrow look for strong southerly winds with increasing cloud cover. The next cold front is slated to arrive early Saturday morning with a noticeable wind shift to the NW at 15-20 mph. Skies should be mostly sunny for Saturday afternoon. Just in time for Christmas, a strong cold front is expected on December 23rd, Christmas Eve high temperatures may only be in the 40's.

Today: Sunny with a high near 62°. Light W-SW winds will shift S-SE in the afternoon.

Tonight: Clear with a low around 35° and a light south wind.

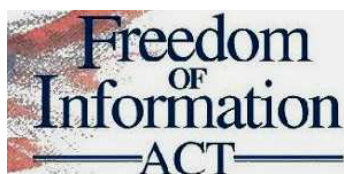
Friday: Increasing clouds and a high near 60°. Wind will be S at 5-15 mph with possible gusts of 30 mph.

Overnight Friday: Cloudy with some clearing and a 20% chance of showers with a low near 47°. Winds will become west at 5-10 mph after midnight and could gust to 20 mph.

Saturday: Sunny with a high temperature near 62°. Winds will be N-NW at 10-15 mph, possibly gusting to 25 mph.

After a long court battle, some light is now being shined on how big money is sometimes spent in



Austin. The Texas Tribune has released the following story, having to do with the inauguration of Governor Greg Abbott:

"To celebrate Gov. Greg Abbott's reelection last year,

his inaugural committee paid a whopping \$1.7 million to hire country crooner George Strait and his band.

A coterie of top political aides and staff got more than \$1 million, some of it paid out in six-figure bonuses. And a handful of lucky charities received \$800,000 in unspent money.

Left out of that tally: the \$116,000 taxpayers spent to keep all those inaugural expenditures secret.

Abbott and the 2019 Texas Inaugural Committee spent months fighting the disclosure of documents detailing how they spent a record-setting \$5.3 million that event organizers raised, mostly from corporations and wealthy donors.

But The Texas Tribune sued the committee under the Texas Public Information Act and earlier this year successfully obtained the bank statements and spending ledger in an out-of-court settlement.

The result is the most detailed and complete account of inaugural spending in decades. Austin attorney Bill Aleshire, who represented the Tribune in the lawsuit, said the legal fight he had to wage to get the records highlights the need for better transparency



in state inaugurations, which suck up gobs of corporate money but face little regulation over how it gets spent."

The newly obtained financial records show that an increasing share of the money has gone to "professional fees," payroll for political staff and fundraisers — some of whom earned six-figure payments from the event last year."

The complicated revelations seem to indicate that the money spent on inaugurations like this are a mix of both private and taxpayer money. One of the curious facts is that private or corporate money that goes into this is not regulated and revealed in the way that campaign contributions are.

Coronavirus Update
