The Weather

Clear skies and dry air will allow temperatures to rise quickly today into the 50's and 60's. Pacific moisture will bring showers tomorrow morning across Central Texas. After overcoming the dry air, the rain will become more widespread in the afternoon. Look for temperatures Friday to be cooler, and on Saturday the lack of sunshine will keep things cool. Central Texans can expect up to .75 inches of rain with this system if the storm slows or thunderstorms develop.

Today: Increasing clouds with a high near 57°. SW wind at 5-10 mph becoming S-SE in the afternoon.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with a low around 39° and SE wind about 5 mph.

I saw something on TV yesterday that mentioned the Civil Defense. Does any-body remember those days in the '50s cold war when we thought the Russians were coming and we were all wishing we had a fallout shelter.



That big hydrogen bomb we feared



would come from a Russian plane was going to either blow us away or the radiation would get us. So many of the young and able-bodied men here joined the Civil Defense Force. My older brother, Scott, was one of them.

I was just a kid but I remember that the men procured an old army surplus van and a jeep or two and painted them white and blue with the Civil Defense signs on the side.

They were to help with rescue efforts in case of attack. They also picked up some surplus generators. One of them was hooked up at Rollins Brook Hospital, another at the fire station and KCYL Radio received one which we kept for several years by our transmitter.

Of course the most interesting part of the CD Force was the elevated platform lookout posts they built. The volunteers all over the country would man the platforms with binoculars and watch for Russian bombers. I seem to vaguely remember one just off North Key Ave. but darned if I remember exactly where. I kind of think it was between Key and the football field. Somebody help me!

At any rate, the Civil Defense Force is a part of our history and we wonder how many old Civil Defense Geiger Counters or helmets are laying around in barns or attics here, relics of our interesting past.

Anyway, it's fun remembering. Here's hoping you'll save some of the things in your life that may be a part of an important history some day. We're rootin' for ya! **Rus**
