The Weather



High yesterday was 81° The low this morning was 43°
The temperature dropped fast this morning, going from 65° at 5:15am to 43° at 8:15am.

Today: 80% chance of rain with temperatures falling to 43° and staying low into the evening. N-NE wind will be 10-15 mph and gusting.

Tonight: A 20% chance of rain before 9pm, then clouds begin to leave, allowing the temperature to drop to about 35°. The N-NW wind, at 10-15 mph with gust to 20 mph.

Saturday: Mostly sunny with a high of only 58° and with a light NW wind of 5-10 mph. A few clouds will come in overnight with a low dropping down to 37°. The indecisive wind will calm, then shift to generally southerly for a while.



The Christmas Forecast: The shift back to southerly wind Saturday night seems meaningless as Christmas Eve day will see a shift back to N-NW at 5-15 mph and the high will get up to perhaps 54°. The wind may gust a little, and Christmas Eve will see us bundling up for any outdoor activities. The low will be down to 31° by morning, bringing just a very light freeze.

Christmas Day will see partly sunny skies and a high near 57°, with the wind E-NE at 5-10 turning south.

Slight rain chances and more north wind seem to come back on Tuesday and Wednesday.

DPS Puts Extra Troopers on Highways

Texas Comptroller Announces Tax Amnesty Program

Comptroller Glenn Hegar has announced a temporary tax amnesty program that gives certain delinquent taxpayers a chance to get compliant with state law without penalties and interest on tax due.



The Texas Tax Amnesty Program will run from May 1 to June 29, 2018. The program applies to periods prior to Jan. 1, 2018, and only includes liabilities that have not been previously reported to the Comptroller.

The Program comes as a result of Senate Bill 1, ordering a tax amnesty program to encourage voluntary reporting by:

- delinquent taxpayers who don't have a Texas Sales and Use Tax Permit, or are not registered for a tax or fee administered by the Comptroller's office; and
- taxpayers who have a permit, but may have underreported or owe additional taxes or fees.

Hegar said. "Maybe you forgot to get a sales tax permit or you inadvertently underreported taxes owed. If you qualify, there are no excuses necessary. You can participate in the coming tax amnesty program and make things right with the state of Texas and your fellow taxpayers."

The Texas Tax Amnesty Program does not apply to periods currently under audit review, IFTA taxes, PUC Gross Receipts assessments, Local Motor Vehicle Tax and Unclaimed Property payments.

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Thursday showed the local PD back to the usual full log of minor calls. It started at 1:09am with a suspicious vehicle in the 200 block of S. Key, then in the same hour a suspicious vehicle in the 200 block of N. Chestnut. In the 3am hour there were two reports of a suspicious person, one near Steel and Ave. B and another a couple blocks away at 1st and Porter.

A minor accident took place at 9:07am in the 100 block of Skipcha Trail and at 9:53am there was a reckless driver on Hwy 281 N.

There was suspicious activity in the 100 block of W. 1st at 1:18pm and at 3:48pm there was a theft reported in the 100 block of E. FM 580. Suspicious activity was reported in the 1000 block of Mills at 5pm.

A disturbance was reported in the 300 block of E. 4th at 6:42pm and in the 11pm hour it wrapped up with suspicious activity in the 400 block of Brown and a reckless driver report in the 800 block of N. Key.

Police Chief Sammy Bailey announced on Thursday that new and reduced speed limit signs were installed on Hwy 281 S. It is hoped that the reduced speeds will help create a safer roadway for the area.

Lampasas Sheriff's Dept. blotter shows Lometa with a quiet day. Kempner had an assault case and a harassment report. Out in the county there was a suspicious person call and some livestock issues, along with high numbers of traffic stops.

The jail log shows a 25 yr old Colorado Springs man arrested for possession of marijuana and for unlawfully carrying a weapon. A 30 yr old Cove man was taken in for evading arrest with a vehicle, and a 60 yr old Gatesville man was arrested for possession of marijuana, possession of a controlled substance, and on an out of county charge.

The Burn Ban in Lampasas Co. has been lifted until next Tuesday. That will allow for some limited fireworks use during the holiday.

Note that fireworks inside the Lampasas city limits are illegal, but outside city limits all but bottle rockets or stick-type fireworks are allowed.

Despite Hurdles, Record Numbers Sign Up For ACA Health Insurance

Washington, D.C. (Dec. 21) – Today, government officials announced that the number of people signing up for health insurance this open enrollment period on HealthCare.gov hit nearly 9 million. Consumers set a new record for weekly enrollment when, from December 10 to December 15, 4,143,968 people selected health insurance plans on HealthCare.gov. The previous high-water mark was 4,078,562 signing up during the week of December 13 to December 19, 2015.

Frederick Isasi, executive director of Families USA, said “Despite efforts by the Trump Administration to suppress enrollment – including cutting the enrollment window in half, slashing funding to provide in-person enrollment assistance, redirecting outreach money, shutting down HealthCare.gov on Sundays, and reducing the advertising budget by a startling 90 percent– families from across the nation overcame the hurdles put in their way and signed up for coverage at an unprecedented pace.”

He applauded the volunteer efforts of nonprofits and volunteers

who helped enroll applicants, stepping-in to provide assistance after the administration’s decision to drastically reduce its own efforts. Isasi said, “We likely will never know how many millions of additional families would have benefited from health insurance if the administration had worked to help them enroll for coverage and not worked against them.”
