Passing of Burnet K9 Officer on

December 20, Burnet County Communications received a call from the wife of Burnet Police Department Officer Jose Meza that Ofc. Meza was experiencing a medical emergency at their residence in Burnet. On-duty BPD officers responded to Ofc. Meza's residence and immediately began lifesaving measures on their coworker. Burnet EMS arrived on scene a short time later and took over patient care, ultimately transporting Ofc. Meza to Seton Highland Lakes Hospital in Burnet. Despite the best efforts of the medical staff involved, Ofc. Meza passed away at the hospital shortly after arrival.

Ofc. Meza was escorted by numerous first responders to the Travis County Medical Examiner's Office where his preliminary cause of death was ruled a heart attack. Ofc. Meza had participated in K9 training with his K9 partner "Kuso" hours before he suffered his fatal heart attack and his passing is being considered a Line of Duty Death by the Department. Ofc. Meza worked for the Burnet Police Department for just over a year and had previously served for the Llano County Sheriff's Office for two and a half years. Ofc. Meza was BPD's K9 handler and worked nightshift patrol with his K9 Kuso.

County Commissioners' Meeting

The Lampasas county commissioners held a called meeting this morning at 9am at the Lampasas County Courthouse. The Commissioners tended to a list of agenda items that included: * It was discussed that the Central Texas Council of Government (CTCOG) has determined a public safety need for 911 physical addressing for certain area of the county. There were 3 separate addressing issues: (1) The recommended names of the private drives off of Blakely Road (off FM 1690) are Private Road 3801 to 3804.

- (3) the residential structures on East FM 580 R Private Road 3601 to Private Road 3604 The county commissioners also went over the burn ban for Lampasas County the current burn ban in effect expires on January 5, 2020 and will transition into the new burn band that will take effect January 6 through April 5 of 2020. The commissioners went over the burn ban. The current burn ban that is in effect without exemptions expires on January 5th 2020, and will be replaced with a new burn ban with exemption January 6th 2020 through April 5th 2020. The exceptions to this burn ban are; Barbeques using above-ground grills in a safe area clear of debris, burning of household trash that is in an enclosed receptacle and covered with mesh material with no more than 1/4 inch openings and supervised in a safe area clear of debris. Controlled burn exemptions for established hay fields, necessary for the maintenance of existing and actively farmed hay fields with a defensible space around the burn area, presence of fire suppression tools, and supervision during the entire controlled burn. Authorized by TCEQ (this order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission for Firefighting Training. public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations, planting or harvesting of agriculture crops or burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager. There is an exemption for fireworks show as follows: "This order does not prohibit an organized Arial display of fireworks conducted by an experienced pyrotechnician for a large audience where fire suppression equipment is present to prevent the spread of fire.
