Lampasas scored first on a solo homer by Kyndal Moyer in the first inning, then a stolen base and Moyer hit a double in the second that brought in another. It kept up with RBIs by Moyer and big hits by Monica Garza, Natalie Denoso, Collyn Schuricht, Hannah Greenberg, Brooklyne Edgar and Sloane Johnson. Cally Reding was on the mound for the entire game with 7 strikeouts and gave up 7 hits.

The Lady Badgers have the rest of Spring Break week off and will head to Leander Glenn on Tuesday of next week.

Badger Baseball is 1-0 in district play after lastinning 6-5 win over Llano.

The Varsity Badger Baseball team won their first district game last night against the Llano Yellow Jackets and what a game it was. The scoring started in the first inning with Llano scoring 1 run on 3 hits. The Badgers in the bottom of the second got a lead-off walk by Jon Davis who later moved to third on a line drive double play. Freshman Ace Whitehead then drove the ball to left bringing Davis in to tie the score 1-1. Hunter Gholson then hit a drive to left center bringing Whitehead in for the go ahead run. Badgers now lead 2-1.

In the top of the third the Badgers make it hard on pitcher Marty Ybarra by making 3 errors that allowed Llano to score 2 runs on only 1 hit. Llano takes the lead back 3-2.

In the bottom of the 4th the Badgers would retake the lead when Whitehead leads off with a single to left center and Gholson earns a walk, then with 2 outs Gage Barry drives one to right center scoring Whitehead and Gholson goes to third, then scores on a mis-played ball hit by Mason Steele. Badgers ahead 4-3 and it appeared it might be enough until the 7th inning.

Ybarra, who had pitched six strong innings, struck out the leadoff batter, giving him his 5th strikeout for the game. He then gave up a single to left and gave the next batter first base on an inside pitch that hit the batter. Ybarra then gave up his 7th hit, that brought in a run tied the game.

With Ybarra's pitch count mounting, Coach Doege made a pitching change that brought Ace Whitehead to the mound, facing runners on first and second with only one out. The next two batters bunted and on both bunts Whitehead slipped on the grass trying to field them and one run scored and the bases loaded. The freshman pitcher rose to the challenge, striking out the next two batters.

Hunter Gholson came up and hit the gap in left center for the walkoff, scoring Ethan Rascoe who was running for Whitehead.

The Lampasas County Museum has appropriately put together a new exhibition, "Celebrating Public Education in Lampasas," that will be on view at the Museum through the month of March.


The museum is open Fridays and Saturdays, 10 am to 4 pm.
