# **Funeral Notices**

**Edmon Daryl Edwards** was born March 17, 1925 to John and Willie (Davis) Edwards in the Joppa Community in Burnet County and passed away at Rollins Brook Community Hospital on his 93<sup>rd</sup> birthday, March 17, 2018.

Daryl and his parents moved to Kempner when he was 3 years old, then to Lampasas in 1936 and to Oakalla in 1939. He graduated from Lampasas High School in 1943 and drove a school bus during his senior year in high school. World War II was in progress and bus drivers were hard to find as many men had been

drafted. Daryl joined the Navy in 1944. After leaving the Navy he lived with his parents on the family ranch in Oakalla and helped with ranch work. He loved playing baseball and basketball.

In 1948, Daryl was appointed as a rural mail carrier for the Oakalla post office and on August 27, 1949 he married Melba Gene Morris. Daryl and Melba lived in Oakalla area for about 4 years. In 1951 they had twin daughters, Sharon and Karon.

The Oakalla rural route and Kempner rural route were consolidated, so the family moved to Lampasas in 1955 where the girls would be able to attend Lampasas schools. While still working for the postal service Daryl received membership from the National Safety Council into the Million Miles Club for driving that far without an accident. He was a member of the National Rural Letter Carrier's Association for 63 years and retired in the early 80's after working 34 years as a carrier.

Daryl and Melba traveled all over the United States and parts of Canada in their RV. One of their trips included Idaho and a jet mail boat ride overnight up the Snake River. Once it was found out that Daryl was a mail carrier they let him put the mail in all the boxes along the river. The couple made 2 trips to Alaska and went to Australia, New Zealand and Nova Scotia with the Heritage Club. They also went to Israel with a large tour group. Daryl is as charter member of New Covenant Church in Lampasas, established in October 1986.

He is survived by his wife Melba of Lampasas; daughters Sharon Moon of San Diego, CA and Karon Justice and husband Pat of Lampasas; grandsons John Moon and Chad Moon of CA; granddaughters Kara Hayden and husband Jim of Lubbock and Shannon Lindsey and husband Robert of Lampasas; and by 8 great-grandchildren as well as many other relatives and a host of long time friends.

# We note the passing:

We can't help but comment on the passing of two people who have been such a part of the core and spirit of Lampasas that, had they not been here, it would have been different.

Their presence was not a noisy part of news publications nor announcements of honors, but both, in their quiet ways, have left their imprint on our town.

Marie Alexander, 1943-2018, grew up here and experienced our school system and every facet of the daily life of our town. She came from a typical large family of the time and she worked, all of her life. She and her husband, Ronnie built a large and successful business enterprise in Lampasas and they served it through the years as it became known all over the area. Now, like so many before and all to come, she leaves the scene and we mourn her passing on the 14<sup>th</sup> of March.

**David Bryant, 1941-2018** was born here in Lampasas but lived in Waco into his early teens when he returned to our town. Like all those of African-American descent in his age group, he lived though that period of segregation and prejudice that brought suffering and hardship.

But, David was a part of Lampasas as surely as any man. In his youth, though not always recalled in our conversations and stories, he was an accomplished musician. David was a member of the "Aces" band, led by "Cockeye."

Some of us remember the many dances held in Lampasas Hostess House where Cockeye and his Aces band would perform the rock and roll music of the day. David Bryant was one of the performers on that stage, and a definable part of our history of music in Lampasas.

Later, David was a partner in a dry cleaning business here and after that worked and lived away from here at times, but was always a face in the crowd at almost every gathering or celebration in our town. We note the passing of David Bryant on the 14<sup>th</sup> of March. He was an integral part of the history and character of Lampasas.
