The Weather



Yesterday's high 76° This morning's low 59°

Today: Partly sunny with a high near 87° and SW wind 5-15 mph.

Tonight: Increasing clouds and a low around 66° with south wind about 5-10 mph.

Sunday: A 30% chance of rain and cloudy, with a high near 87°. The south wind will be gentle. Overnight the rain chances continue and the temperature drops to 64° with the south wind getting up to 10-15 mph or more.

Next week: Monday, the rain chances are very slight, but still cloudy and a high near 84° in the afternoon. The wind will get even stronger, gusting to 25 mph. Monday night the rain chances rise to about 40% and on Tuesday it will get up to a 50% chance of some kind of rain.

Tuesday night another cool front will come in with N-NE winds 10-15 mph and the rain chances get up to 70% as we go into Wednesday with a high of only about 65°. This long range forecast seems to show that Thursday and into the Easter weekend the weather will be pretty moderate.

The Weekend

Today will see some of the best and brightest from Lampasas High at the District Academic Meet at Liberty Hill with competition starting at 8am.

Other school related events see the Colorguard Contest going on at Hendrickson High with Lampasas marchers on hand for the competition. Locally, some student athletes will take part in the Books & Badgers effort at Lampasas Public Library.

Lampasas Historic Courthouse, built in 1883, is the subject of guided tours every Saturday at 11am and 2pm. Those interested should meet the tour guides at the south entrance to the courthouse.

Coming Up Monday

Lampasas County Commissioners have a regularly scheduled Monday morning meeting at 9am in the lower floor of the courthouse. On their agenda is a simple consent agenda and a request to put a 1 inch water line under CR 3390 to serve a resident in the T.R. Carson subdivision. There are also utility installation arrangements having to do with the new jail construction in south Lampasas just off Hwy 183.

Lometa School Board will meet on Monday at 6:30pm in the school library at 8th and Main. On their agenda is a move to cancel the May 5th Trustee Election, since there were no opposing candidates. They will also spend some time on school board policies. Perhaps most important of those policies is **consideration of employees approved for concealed handgun carry on Lometa ISD property**. There is also the consideration of an audit agreement for the school's annual audit and other financial matters.

Lampasas City Council will meet on Monday at 5:30pm for a workshop session and at 7pm for their regular session. Once again there are routine zoning and permit matters and much of the discussions will have to do with building and home construction in our growing community.
