The Weather

The High yesterday 69° This morning's low 37°

Today: Sunny, with a high near 61° and N-NE wind between 5 and 10 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear with a low around 37° and E-NE wind around 5 mph but shifting to S-SE.

Thursday: Partly sunny with a high near 66° and south wind 5-15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph. Overnight the low will drop to 48° with south wind 5-10.

Rest of the week: Friday will bring a warmer day, up to 71° with the southerly breeze that will get up to 10-15 mph and gusting. More wind on Saturday, but that warm front is getting closer as it looks like Saturday afternoon will be the warm one, getting up to 85° and windy, but...overnight it will change again. On Sunday, another of what we keep hoping will be the last gasp of winter. The north wind will return and the high will only be about 68° with very strong north wind.

Runoffs Shape Up For County Officer Primaries

When the tallying up was done last night at the Lampasas County Election Office it was clear that there would be runoffs. For Lampasas County Judge in the Republican Primary, former Lampasas County Attorney Larry Allison was the leader with 1,374 (43.9%) votes, followed by 1,345 (42.18%) votes for former Lampasas ISD Superintendent Randy Hoyer. The two ran away from challenger Greg Crawford with about 15% of the vote.

There will now be a Runoff Election between Allison and Hoyer. For District Clerk Edith Wagner led with 1,103 (35.5%), followed by Trina Hudson with 1,003 (32.28%) and both ahead of current District Clerk Cody Reed with 1,001(32.22%).

There will now be a Runoff Election between Wagner and Hudson. For Commissioner, Precinct 2, Lometa ISD official Jamie Smart led with 473 (38.9%) of the vote, followed by Ron Farr with 396 (32.57%) and also followed closely by Chris Harrison with 347 (28.54%).

There will now be a Runoff Election between Smart and Farr. In the County Clerk race, incumbent Connie Hartmann carried it away with 2,204 (72.52%)

In the County Treasurer Race Melissa Karcher won with 1,842 (60.87%) of the vote, beating Sharon Watson with 1,184 (39.13%). In the District 54 State Representative race, pitting Killeen Veterinarian Brady Buckley against incumbent Scott Cosper, Buckley picked up 1,325 (42.44%) and Cosper got 1,312 (42.02%). The other candidate, Larry Smith got a marginal 15% of the vote. In Bell County, Cosper got 3,160 and Buckley got 2,848, bring the total District vote for Cosper to 4472 (44.56%) and Buckley to 4,173 (41.58%). Larry Smith had 14%.

There will be a runoff between Cosper and Buckley.
All of the Runoff Elections will take place on May 22nd.
All of the above is about the Republican Primary, which is the vast majority of the vote in Lampasas County. However, there were apparently 392 ballots cast in the Democratic Primary, which was about 10% of the total vote on Tuesday. That low number of Democratic Primary voters was probably due to the fact that no

Democrats were on County Race Ballots.

The Lampasas Democrat turnout was pale in comparison to the Democratic Party's victory statewide in coming up with what appears to be around 38 or 39% of the total vote at this point. The Democrats have managed to field a few candidates so far that will contest Republican office holders in the General Election in November, and there are now some runoff races in which other Democratic champions will be chosen to represent that party in November.

The May Primary Runoff will see Andrew White and Lupe Valdez contesting to run for Governor in the General Election against Greg Abbott, and Chris Perri and Julie Oliver will be in that Runoff for the right to challenge Roger Williams for his 25th Congressional District seat in the U.S. House.

Goodwill will be on site to accept clothing, household items, and appliances. Used oil, antifreeze, petroleum products and cooking oil will be accepted at the Recycle Center. Items such as fire alarms, smoke detectors, explosives, pressurized containers, medication/prescription drugs and trash will not be accepted.

Tires will also be accepted during this event. For car/light truck tires, four tires are free and \$3 per additional tire. Large tires will be priced on site. Tires have to be off the rim.

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Tuesday showed a very quiet morning but a busy evening.

At 12:36pm there was a disturbance in the 200 block of S. Porter and at 4:47pm there was a minor, no injuries, accident in the 600 block of S. Ridge.

The busy evening began with a reckless driver report on Hwy 281S at 7:40pm, then a minor accident in that same area, in the 1900 block, at 8:02pm. That resulted in a DWI arrest. At 8:30pm, 30 yr old Douglas Cooper Wilkison of Lampasas was arrested in the 1900 block of 281S and charged with DWI with blood alcohol level of .15% and an accident involving damage to a vehicle over \$200.

But, when we read up about Bastrop's problem. It seems there was a chicken sanctuary in a certain part of town that allowed chickens to run free. They call it the Farm Street chicken area. It was just fun for a while, but then the area's free-ranging chickens began to stray... Now, with all the complaints about the cacklers and crowers, Bastrop is out trappin' chickens and giving them to country people in the area.
