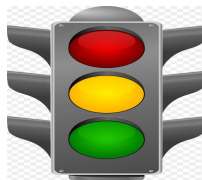
Overnight, the rain chances get higher at about 50-50.

Although web-applications developers appear to have a great future, computer operator jobs are one of the worst with 23% of those jobs expected to be cut by 2026.

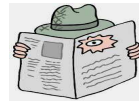
Please come to Badger Field for this last game of the season and for the last game for the seniors on the team.
