The Weather

The High yesterday was 86° The Low this morning 58° Today: Sunny, with a high near 90° and S-SW wind around 5 mph

...and that is a general pattern for the week. **Tonight:** Mostly clear, with a low around 63° and south wind that will be 5-10 mph.

Tuesday: Another mostly sunny day with a high near 89° and S-SW wind 5-15 mph and a bit gusty at times.

Overnight Tuesday and early Wednesday morning will get down to about 63° with south wind continuing.

The rest of the Week: Wednesday will be sunny, and up to about 88°. Thursday, with a high around 86° and south wind. Friday will be more of the same and so will Saturday.

Election Results

Saturday's Elections in Lampasas County resulted in another woman, Cathy Kuehne, winning a seat on Lampasas City Council. She took 195 votes in Saturday's Place 4 Election, while opposing candidate, T.J. Wright, tallied 136 votes.



This brings the gender tilt on the Lampasas Council to 4-3 in favor of the girls. It's a historical first – so far as we can tell – where there has been a majority of women serving on the Lampasas Council.

In Lometa the at-large race for two Council seats saw the incumbents Shad Hill and Larry Koch re-elected to Council while Dale Robinson and Julia Thomas will have to wait for another day as their tallies were short of the mark.

The other upcoming Election is the May 22^{nd} Runoff. Early Voting for that one will begin on Monday, May 14^{th} .


